The Lord is Kind and Merciful... So, Do to Others... (Sharing Our Faith)

First Reading:

(I Samuel 26:2,7-9, 12-13, 22-23)

In this First Reading, King Saul is on the search for David in order to kill him because David is a threat to him. David's Attendant, Abishai, was ready to take the king's sword and kill him with one thrust when they quietly came in the camp where Saul was sleeping. David refused when he said, "Do not harm him, for who can lay hands on the Lord's anointed and remain unpunished." (I Samuel 26:9)

Psalm Response:

(Psalm 103)

Reflect on the following verses of this Psalm and answer the two questions.

"He pardons all your iniquities, heals all your ills. He redeems your life from destruction, crowns you with kindness and compassion." (Psalm 103:3-4)

- —From what iniquities or ills that God has healed you?
- —Where in your life have you experienced our Lord's Kindness and Compassion?

Second Reading:

(I Corinthians 15:45-49)

Do we think that our Lord Jesus Christ wants us to image Him to the whole world each day? One effective way we can do this is by striving to be loving and forgiving to others. Even if we might not feel like doing this, pray for the grace to be at peace in your own thoughts about someone who has hurt you. In time, if you are consistent with this prayer for peace, the Lord will help you go to the next level of forgiveness and mercy towards that person.

Gospel: (Luke 6;27-38)

There is a lot that Jesus in this *Sermon on the Plain* according to Saint Luke. It can all be summed up to be — **kind and merciful**. Some of Jesus's list of being **kind and merciful** are the following:

- -"Do to others as you would have them do to you"
 (Luke 6:3)
- -"...love your enemies, do good to those who hate you" (Luke 6:35)
- -"Give to everyone who asks of you" (Luke 6:30)
- -"Stop judging and you will not be judged" (Luke 6:37)

My brothers and sisters, we might not always feel like we can live these Scripture Passages or want to take a risk in being **kind and merciful** to people who treat us badly and unfairly. I believe, the answer is to pray for those who are not kind and merciful to you and work at trying to see the good that is within them. You may never become their friend but never stop praying for them and believe for them that the good in them will be their salvation.

Groups or individuals wishing to have information published in the bulletin are asked to submit the information in writing, by email or by phone by Monday at 10:00 a.m.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate - Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon

Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
