AN EASTER EVENING STORY

Have you ever thought that an Easter evening could be almost as exciting as Easter morning? It's true, that with some families, their tradition is to celebrate with an "open house" with relatives and friends to join the family throughout the day and well into the evening, with a lot of entrees of ethnic foods and desserts. And why not? The Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ is an event that really needs to be celebrated everyday when we awaken each morning and thank God for another "new day" of life. It is important to say though that during that first Easter day, the Apostles celebration of our Risen Lord was quite different than ours.

According to St. John and St. Lukes's Gospel, a lot of mixed emotions were happening on that first Easter. We heard about the amazement of Mary Magdalene and the other women going to the tomb early in the morning, only to discover that Jesus was not there. Then, the same thing happened to Peter and John because Jesus had been raised from the dead. But what went on Easter evening? Last Sunday's Gospel, we heard that the Apostles had locked themselves up in the upper room where they had celebrated the Last Supper with Jesus. They were afraid that the Jewish leaders would crucify them as they did to Jesus. However, Jesus appeared and said, "Peace be with you."...."The Disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord." (Jn 20: 19-20)

This Sunday, in Luke's Gospel, it was a different emotion. When Jesus appeared to the Apostles, they were "startled and terrified." (Lk 24: 37) Jesus assured them that He was present to them to bring peace. Jesus brings us peace, too.

Another Easter evening story happened to Joe and his mom & dad several years ago. Joe is a priest and he came to visit his family early in the afternoon on Easter Sunday. After a wonderful meal, Father Joe's sister and her husband needed to go back to their home and Father Joe was staying at his parents home overnight.

Late that evening, his father said that he could not breathe. The ambulance came and brought his father to the hospital. Before his dad was put into the ambulance, Father Joe anointed him with the Sacrament of the Oil of the Infirm.

A few days later, after a heart catheterization, Father Joe's dad was sent home. It was recommended that he not have a heart operation because of his age, but he was given a new medication in order to treat his congestive heart failure. Father Joe's dad lived for another four years in fairly good health and continued doing the activities that he had been used to doing. The Resurrection Grace of the Anointing of the Sick really helped and intervened in Father Joe's dad. (continued in left column)

Groups or individuals wishing to have information published in the bulletin are asked to submit the information in writing, by email or by phone by Monday at 10:00 a.m.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. - Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SÁCRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon

Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
