The Sacrament of the Eucharist

I remember talking with a person several years ago who never had been baptized and was never raised in the Christian Faith, but

always felt a "special presence of peace" whenever the few times he attended Mass with a friend. Even though he did not know the prayers and the responses at Mass, he still felt inspired. Sometimes on the way home from work, he would stop in the Catholic Church by himself for a few moments and would sense again and again the "presence of the Lord" as he began to describe this inspiration . . . What was this *presence*? It was Jesus, the Bread of Life, Whose Presence is at Mass in the Sacred Host and always present in the Blessed Tabernacle.

In light of our Scripture Readings at Mass today and for several Sundays to come, I will be sharing with you thoughts and teachings about the Sacrament of the Eucharist — that is, the Mass based on John chapter 6. I have just mentioned Jesus's Presence in the Eucharist. The following Sundays I will share some historical development of the Mass.

The story I shared in the above opening paragraph really says that the celebration of the Eucharist is a "miracle of presence." The miracle is JESUS HIMSELF present in the "Prayer of Consecration" at every Mass. It is here where the simple gifts of bread and wine are changed and transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. We are then privileged and blessed to receive our Lord during the time of distribution of Holy Communion.

My friends, Just as in our First Reading today, Elisha the Prophet ordered that the twenty barley loaves be given to the people (with some left over), and just as Jesus gave thanks and multiplied the fish and the loaves for the five thousand people (with some left over), so too will He always provide His real Presence at every Mass. Jesus will multiply His Blessings in our lives and in others with many graces left over to be given as we ask for them in faith. Two questions to ask yourself:

- † Have you experienced Jesus's Presence at Mass?
- † When are the times when you felt God's multiple Blessings in your life?

May His Presence help you grow in faith.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. - Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate - Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request. Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
