The Healing Power of Words in a Hymn

Words are very important and have a powerful effect, especially in the lyrics of a hymn. These songs are created to bring inspiration to us in describing God's Love for us, in order to build up and affirm our faith. The music itself can bring a calming and peaceful feeling as we listen to or sing the song.

One song in our Breaking Bread Hymnal © 2023 OCP that speaks of God's Healing is: <u>"Healing River of the Spirit"</u>. A look at the first verse expresses Jesus' Healing Ministry recorded in the Gospel, as well as in some of the writings of St. Paul's letters. I will explain each line of this verse that is in bold, italicized lettering. The explanation is in the parenthesis.

<u>Verse One "Healing River of the Spirit, bathe the wounds</u> <u>that living brings."</u> (We all know that life is not easy. We all have responsibilities that need to be fulfilled daily. This, along with misunderstanding, conflict in relationships, poor health, and limited resources can be the <u>wounds</u> that living brings. We are asking God to bathe and cleanse us, by the power of God's Word, from the negative effects of those wounds.)

<u>"Plunge our pain, our sin, our sadness, deep beneath</u> <u>Your Sacred Springs."</u> (This part of the verse expresses, even more clearly, what those wounds are. The wounds are pain, sin, and sadness. May I suggest, too, that both physical and psychological pain, along with sin, can both be the cause of sadness in ones life. We are asking God in these words to plunge us again into the healing waters of our Baptismal calling. Concerning sin, Saint Paul says; "through Baptism into Christ's Death, we were buried with Him, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of God the Father, we too might live a new life.") (Romans Ch. 6 Verse 4)

(Then also concerning sadness and pain, Saint Paul says; "dismiss all anxiety from your minds. Present your needs to God in every form of prayer and in petition full of gratitude. Then God's own Peace, which is beyond all understanding, will stand guard over your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus our Lord." (*Philippians Ch. 4 Verses6-7*) The peace of Jesus can flow over us like a sacred spring of water.)

<u>"Weary from the restless searching that has lured us from Your Side."</u>

(Sometimes we may have searched for other beliefs or things in life we thought would satisfy us more than our faith in God. Some of these searches have actually lead us away from God and our prayer life. Saint Augustine once said; "our hearts are restless until they rest in God." This is what the words "restless searching" is saying.

Finally, the last words of this first verse, is as follows: *"We discover in Your Presence Peace the world cannot*

provide. Ruth C. Duck: fr Circles of Care ©1996 The Pilgrim Press (When we pray and truly offer our sincere prayer, with all our heart to the Lord, we can discover in Jesus' Presence, His Holy Peace that the world cannot provide. This comes from *John Ch. 14 Verse 27*. The world may say at times that an over abundance of wealth, all for oneself, or the over dependency of alcohol, will bring peace in ones life. On the contrary, only our relationship with the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, in daily prayer, and the power of God's Word-the Bible and the Church's Sacraments can bring lasting peace in our lives.)

My friends, as we read and hear about Jesus healing a man from an unclean spirit in today's Gospel according to Mark Ch. 1 Verses 21-28, may we be encouraged to pray for the necessary healings that we want for our world, our families, and for ourselves. Trust that God's Word and all of its power and grace will bring about the healing that we long for.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist - Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 9th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. - Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.
