What Really is Glory?

My friends, I believe that when we think about glory, we may recall the *Glory to God Hymn of Praise* that we sing together at the beginning of Mass. We sing this hymn because we want to give God the credit, praise, and thanksgiving for all that He has given us, especially the Mass and all that He enables us to do for His Glory (In other words glory is also the awesome *Goodness of God.*). This kind of glory is reflected in our lives along with all our human gifts, talents, abilities and our spiritual life.

In our Gospel Jesus is acknowledging and thanking God the Father for the glory and work in His Life and the glory of discipleship in His Apostles. In this setting of the Last Supper, Jesus is offering a prayer aloud for His Apostles to hear so they, too, can give glory back to God for all they do for our Lord.

So, too, with us whenever each of us acknowledges God's Glory in our life through prayer and action as Jesus did, God takes our gifts and returns them to us in greater abundance. At the same time, God blesses other people with gifts and graces when we offer our prayers and service towards them. Jesus concludes His Prayer for His Apostles with the words: "I pray for them ... the ones You have given Me, because they are Yours ..."(John 17:9) The Glory of God is ultimately reflected in us because we belong to God. Groups or individuals wishing to have information published in the bulletin are asked to submit the information in writing, by email or by phone by Monday at 10:00 a.m.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate - Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SÁCRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon

Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m. or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
