Let us pray that those who risk their lives for the Gospel in various parts of the world might imbue the Church with their courage and missionary drive.



Thoughts on the Mass (continued)

- 4. At this point in the Mass, we greet each other and we are invited to sing the opening hymn. The hymn will often times express the theme of the Mass or the Readings.
- 5. As the hymn begins, the servers, lector, and the priest process to the Altar. The lector holds high the Book of the Gospels and then places the Book on the Altar.
- 6. The priest comes around and venerates (kisses) the Altar and proceeds to his chair. The reason for the veneration is because the Altar symbolizes Christ.

The Ten Commandments (Part One) From our First Reading at Mass

How well are we all living the Ten Commandments? Take this time to reflect and correct every area of life that is not living out these commandments in the way God intended. (Exodus 20: 1-17)

- l. "I, the Lord, am Your God. You shall not have other gods besides Me." Do we spend too much time caring or worrying about the things in our life that control our life, or too much pleasure in selfish pursuits? Do we strive to put God first in our life, instead of *things*?
- 2. "You shall not take the Name of the Lord your God in vain." Do we swear in taking God's Name? Or, are we exercising self control in the midst of anger?
- 3. "Remember to keep Holy the Sabbath Day." For us Catholic Christians, we all know that Sunday is the special day of the Lord that we keep holy. Praying the rosary, reading Sacred Scripture, having family prayer intentions, or the Spiritual Communion Prayer are important ways of keeping our Sundays Holy. But, going to Mass, is the MOST important way we keep Holy the Sabbath Day-Sunday.
- 4. "Honor your father and your mother." Are children obeying and respecting their parents? Are younger adults respecting and taking their parents advice and guidance? Are all adults taking special care and concern of their elderly parents? Are all of us, at any age, respecting the elderly people in society, nursing homes, etc..?
- 5. "You shall not kill." This commandment not only forbids anyone to outright take another person's life, but also forbids everyone in planning or assisting anyone else in ending another person's life. None of us has physically killed anyone we will say, but have we killed someone's spirit by discouraging them unfairly, bullying them, or hurting someone in any way?

This Season of Lent is a perfect time to review these Ten Commandments of which I will complete next weekend.

BULLETIN INFORMATION

Groups or individuals wishing to have information published in the bulletin are asked to submit the information in writing, by email or by phone by **Monday** at **10:00 a.m**.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 9th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill. The Sacrament is also available upon request.

Reconciliation – Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
