The Epiphany of the Lord January 3, 2021

Light: Epiphany has come to us in a roudabout way. Like the magi, this feast came from the East. In the fourth century, a pilgrim to the Holy Land reported that the Nativity of Christ was celebrated in a vigil that began in the darkness of January 5 and lasted well into the sunrise on January 6. Though the Western Church celebrated Christmas on December 25, it eventually adopted this Eastern celebration called Epiphany (from the Greek word meaning "manifestation" or "appearance.") Both Christmas and Epiphany are celebrations of light: Christmas coincides with the winter solstice and the lengthening of daylight; Epiphany follows the light of the star and becomes the great "Festival of Lights" that celebrates the dawning of the Light who is Jesus Christ.

Stars are bright and beautiful. Poets sing of them. Mariners once plied the seas by them. Travelers were oriented by them. A great star stood in the sky for all to see. This feast day is important because it is ours. It beckons all the earth's inhabitants to seek the Maker of the stars and to confess their faith in the Maker's Son. On this day, we set out on a journey of faith. We keep out eyes of faith clear. We do not blink when faith becomes difficult. We do not fear when faith is racked with doubt. We see and bow low. We seek to be received by the one we have come to see. We return home another way.

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments - January is Human Trafficking Prevention Month: Who are the perpetrators? Traffickers can be anyone who profits from the selling of a child for sex to a buyer, including family members, foster parents, friends, gangs, trusted adults, or "boyfriends." Much of the trafficking of children has moved from street corners and truck stops to the internet where children are sold for sex. Online classified sites allow traffickers and buyers anonymity and accessibility when exploiting children. In some case, there is no identified trafficker, and it is the person buying sex from the child who is exploiting the child's vulnerabilities. A child cannot consent to being bought and sold for sex, and anyone purchasing sex from a child is committing a serious crime. If you suspect a case of Child Sex Trafficking you can call 1-800-THE-LOST or make a report at www.CyberTipline.org. Visit https://www.eriercd.org/childprotection/ to see what the diocese is doing to help maintain safe environments for children and youth.

The Solemnity of the Epiphany is celebrated either on January 6 or, according to the decision of the episcopal conference, on the Sunday between January 2 and January 8. The young Messiah is revealed as the light of the nations. Yet, as the antiphon for the *Magnificat* at Second Vespers reminds us, three mysteries are encompassed in this solemnity: the adoration of the Christ Child by the Magi, the Baptism of Christ and the wedding feast at Cana. Extra candles and/or lamps may be placed around the sanctuary and in other parts of the church to honor Christ revealed as the Light of the Gentiles (*Ceremonial of Bishops*). It is customary to replace the images of the shepherds at the crib with the three Magi and their gifts. — *Ceremonies of the Liturgical Year*, Msgr. Peter J. Elliott, Ignatius Press.
