We know the last few months have been both stressful and challenging. We're committed to making things easier for our customers. That's why we're pleased to announce the UGI Emergency Relief Program, to help those having a difficult time paying their energy bills as a result of the COVID-19 Pandemic. This program has recently been approved by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PUC). UGI is urging qualified customers to enroll now!

What is the UGI Emergency Relief Program?

The Emergency Relief Program includes an installment plan which will allow you to spread your outstanding UGI balance over a period of time. This will allow extra time to catch up on your outstanding balance. The Emergency Relief Installment Plan will be calculated after your December 2020 bill is generated.

How do I know my business is eligible for the UGI Emergency Relief Program?

Your business is eligible if it has closed operations due to its status as a non-essential life-sustaining business or had business operations partially suspended due to a COVID-19-related order.

UGI will not terminate your service if you (1) provide proof of eligibility for the Emergency Relief Program, (2) meet all qualifications of the program, and (3) follow program guidelines by making monthly payments on or before the due date after the program begins. While the Emergency Relief Program will not be implemented until late 2020, customers are **encouraged to make reasonable monthly payments** until the program begins. Making payments prior to the start of the Emergency Relief Program will help keep your account balance and future payments more manageable.

How do I enroll in the UGI Emergency Relief Program?

There are two ways to enroll:

- **Online at www.ugi.com/reliefnow**
Complete our short enrollment form. You will then receive an Emergency Relief Program Agreement by email via DocuSign. DocuSign is an online tool that will allow you to securely upload documents demonstrating program eligibility. Information will be provided on how to submit your documents via DocuSign.

Our Customer Service Representatives are available Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm and will be able to assist you with enrolling in the Emergency Relief Program.

Liturgy of the Word

In the first reading, the Lord speaks through Ezekiel, telling the people that he is the shepherd caring for his sheep. He provides for all their needs, and will judge between sheep, and *between rams and goats*.
