### November 29<sup>th</sup>

Let us stir up our faith more and remember that resounding victory of the Israelites over the Midianites recorded in sacred Scripture. We read that in the middle of the night, when the enemy had come out of their trenches and were resting in the camp, suspecting nothing, they were silently surrounded by just three hundred of Gideon's warriors. Each man had a trumpet in one hand and a jar with a lit torch in the other hand. At their captain's signal, they broke the jars with a loud crash and blew their trumpets. After every blast they lifted up their war cry: "For the LORD and for Gideon" [Judges 7:18] At their tremendous cry, the loud noise of the trumpets, and the immense flash of light in their faces, great terror came upon the enemy camp, and they all began to run in a confused fashion, still heavy with sleep, while the trumpets continued to send out their grim sound. A great number of the enemy, in the indescribable confusion of their hurried flight, massacred one another, leaving mounds of dead bodies in the camp. The Israelites obtained this victory, as we saw, not with weapons but through a very unique war strategy. Well, we also are sustaining a difficult war as long as we are alive. Let us win this war with Gideon's very unique strategy. Let us make the light desire for God's work go before us in this battle. Let us also fight to the sound of hymns, psalms, and spiritual songs as we sing and lift up loud voices to the Lord.
