The responsorial psalm sits right after the first reading and acts as a perfect echo of the God-seeker. The one who longs for the presence of the Lord in daily life is like the thirsty one seeking water. The psalm is filled with the joy and alertness that describes perfectly the one for whom God is the end--and the beginning and the middle, for that matter.
