## Third Sunday of Lent March 15, 2020

Water: For a desert people, a green, well-watered place is heaven on earth. It is no wonder that God chose a garden for Adam and Eve. In the desert, we search for an oasis. For all the severe beauty of the desert, it is water that we need. Today, we return to the waters of life, the waters of baptism.

We can turn the question posed in the first reading, "is the Lord in our midst or not?" to this: "The Lord is in our midst. Do we care about this or not?" If we have forgotten, Lent is out time to learn again. Our confidence to enter into Lent lies not in our moral toughness but in the constancy of the One who is in out midst, the One who gives living waters.

Try this: go without water for an uncomfortable amount of time. Then slowly and carefully savor the experience of drinking water. Then re-read today's Gospel and see where it leads you.

- 1. How does the metaphor of living waters help you appreciate the meaing of Jesus in your life?
- 2. How does the patience of God show in the first reading? How is the patience and daring of Jesus made evident in the Gospel?

#### Liturgy of the Word

In the first reading, the Lord sends Samuel to Jesse of Bethlehem because the Lord has chosen the new king from among Jesse's sons. Samuel goes, and anoints David *in the presence of his brothers*.

In Saint Paul's Letter to the Ephesians, he exhorts them to *live as children of light*.

In the Gospel, Jesus encounters a man blind from birth. After Jesus gives the man sight, the Pharisees become divided over the account. The man defends Jesus, explaining that he must be from God.
