The Future: To some extent the future is now. Our present acts and attitudes create our future. But we know that we come up short here. Our grasp is not wide enough; our understanding is too paltry. We can fiddle with probabilities and make projections from past experience. We can consult the computer printouts or the Farmer's Almanac, but we can't see very far. We have to tend to our present and think rationally about the future, but a greater truth guides us and tempers our plans. Our faith shows us that our future is in God's hands. There are surprises and wonders in store for us. Often we say to ourselves and others, "Well, who wouldn've thunk it?"

Paul tells us in the second reading that the scriptures have been written that we might be instructed and find a source of hope. The opposites unite when we make it out crucial and vital work to accept one another as we have been accepted by Christ and in him. We can be fatihful because God is faithful. Salvation is the great wonder we celebrate in this most sunless time of year. Salvation is ours because God is good, not because we are. For we, by and large, are in the dark. The first, slight turn of our heart toward conversion is out Advent offering. There is just no end to what God can do with this kind of humility. That's the sacred mystery. It is a great wonder--the way God meets us and catches us up.


