FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Over the course of my time here as pastor, I have mentioned Vatican II many times in homilies, columns, and conversations. But what exactly is Vatican II? Vatican II was a council of the church convened by Pope St. John XXIII in 1959 with the goal of renewing Catholic life and uniting all Christians. The bishops met in Saint Peter's Basilica for two months during the autumn over the course of 4 years beginning October 11, 1962 and ending December 8, 1965. On average there were 2200 bishops from 116 countries that met. The council lasted for 38 months, although the bishops met for only 8 of them. Over the other 30 months much of the actual work was completed by sub-committees made up of bishops and theological experts. Over 70 schemas (draft documents) were prepared for consideration by the bishops.

Throughout the four years the council produced 16 documents. The documents present a coherent unit and offer a vision for the church. That vision was intended to reevaluate, renew, and reform contemporary Catholic life for the sake of the effectiveness of the mission of the Church. In a sense, the bishops sought to rebalance various dimensions of doctrine and church life that had become unbalanced over the years.

The council authoritatively promulgated these documents to be normatively constitutional for the Catholic Church. In other words we are not free to simply disregard them. Father Ríck


PARISH NEWS
