Child Abuse Protection and Creating Safe Environments

Child Abuse Prevention Month—Reporting Suspected Child Abuse is Everyone's Responsibility: It is every adult's moral responsibility to report suspected abuse or neglect of a minor to the responsible authorities. Sexual abuse of minors is a pervasive societal problem, and only concerted and sustained efforts by all adults in every segment of society can help to protect children and youth. In the 2019 state report there were 5,102 substantiated reports of child abuse in Pennsylvania in 2018. 47.4% of the substantiated reports were for sexual abuse. To report suspected abuse of a minor, call Childline at 1-800-932-0323 (anytime 24/7). Visit https://www.eriercd.org/childprotection/ to learn how mandated reporters in the Erie diocese are required to report suspected child abuse.
