FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Last week I wrote about celebrating solemnities, such as the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart or the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul. Within the Church calendar solemnities rank third in the order of celebration. In other words, there are some celebrations that will take precedence over those types of solemnities. Those celebrations are the Sacred Triduum, the Nativity of the Lord, Ash Wednesday, Sundays in Advent, Lent and the Easter Season, Holy Week and the Octave of Easter. If this seems confusing to you, you're not alone. Priests have to use the small book called the Ordo to keep things straight.

Beyond solemnities there are Feasts, Obligatory Memorials, and Optional Memorials. Within the level of celebrations called "Feast", there are feasts of the Lord, Sundays in Christmas Time and Ordinary Time, Feasts of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Feasts of Saints, such as St. Thomas the Apostle which we celebrated on July 3rd. Most Feasts have readings and prayers that are specific to the celebration.

Obligatory Memorials are celebrations of saints, such as St. Francis of Assisi, which will be celebrated any where in the world.

Those days will have specific prayers for the day and may or may not have specific readings.

Optional Memorials are celebrations of saints that may not have the universal appeal as those celebrated as Obligatory Memorials. Celebrations in this category may or may not be celebrated in a particular parish. Examples of saints whose celebrations are optional are St. Maria Goretti, celebrated on July 6th, or St. Henry, celebrated on July 13th.

Generally, I celebrate Optional Memorials if the saint has some connection to the parish. Otherwise I will use that Mass for the weekday during Ordinary Time.

Confusing? It certainly is for me. Keeping all of this straight is the reason for the book we call the Ordo.
