A few weeks ago, Becky Harper asked if I had ever heard of Alan Lightman, a professor at M.I.T. who has written a book called In Praise of Wasting Time. I confessed that I hadn't heard of him, but was interested in finding out a little more about him. After a brief search on the internet (Google is your friend), I decided to get the book and read it.

Lightman takes a secular approach to the problem that our lives are moving at such a fast pace that we really don't have the time to process all the information we take in during a day. Without processing the information, we cannot hope to integrate it by making relevant connections in our lives. But Lightman contends we can only do that by taking some quiet time away from the constant flow of information.

Throughout the book Lightman uses academic studies, surveys and his own experience to support his contention. One such study concluded that the subjects studied are actually walking faster now than in previous generations because they don't want to waste more time walking than is necessary.

He concludes his book by making some suggestions, all of which include taking some quiet time to process. The results of this action would help to reduce the stress in our lives and help to improve the

What I find so interesting about the book is that Lightman proposes on the secular side what spiritual guides propose on the spiritual side. Spiritual guides suggest that we take as little as ten minutes a day to sit quietly in the presence of God which we can find anywhere. Father Rick

you are expected to follow the precepts of the church. If you are interested in this ministry, or have any questions, please call the parish office.


