FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

One of the phrases that was repeated numerous times during the Second Vatican Council was "reading the signs of the times". The phrase indicates that Pope John XXIII believed that the Holy Spirit was active and prompting the bishops of the church to meet. The efforts of the bishops during Vatican II was to take what was central to the church and present that to the world in a way that made sense to people.

One of the areas addressed by the bishops was the church. There are two primary documents on the church, Lumen Gentium (the Dogmatic Constitution on the Church) and Gaudium et Spes (the Church in the Modern World). These two documents help people to understand what the church is and how the church should relate to the world.

Prior to Vatican II the church was often viewed as a pyramid, with the Pope at the top, the bishops next, followed by the clergy and the religious, and then the laity as the base of the pyramid. That's why prior to Vatican II parish life was structured entirely differently than it is now. Before Vatican II the pastor's word was law. Most parishioners accepted that stance because they thought that the priest knew more than they did.

The problem with that structure is that there is an undervaluing of the dignity of each baptized person and the call of that person to participate in God's plan of salvation. Vatican II sought to correct this oversight by using the model of "the People of God" and the "Body of Christ" to highlight the importance of each baptized person in God's plan of salvation.

The result was that the church recognized each person had a role to play using their gifts and talents to build up the church. Therefore, parishioners were invited to take a more active role in the administration of the parish. We see that today in finance councils, pastoral councils, liturgy committees, etc.

Not only does each baptized person have a role to play, but that role is important for bringing God's plan of salvation to fruition.
