FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

One of the very beautiful documents from Vatican II is the Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation, Dei Verbum. Promulgated on November 18, 1965 Dei Verbum saw revelation as the selfcommunication of our Triune God for the sake of salvation. This self-communication requires faith—the personal and communal reception of God's self-gift in love and the personal and communal assent to the divine truths communicated within that personal encounter.

Revelation is a loving invitation to relationship with God. This relationship is a loving encounter with God that takes place through the divine actions in history and not just through the communication of words. Therefore, revelation is not only something that happened in the past but is a present reality that can be fulfilled only at the end of time.

Rather than viewing revelation primarily as instruction from the divine teacher and a communication of truths, we should see revelation as a communication of God's very Self in love to all humans at a deeply personal level. God's will is that all people can and should draw near to the Father, through Christ, the Word made flesh, in the Holy Spirit and thus become sharers in the divine nature.

During this new liturgical year, perhaps, we can all grow in our awareness of God's love for us, accepting God's invitation to relationship. Father Ríck
