From the desk of the Pastor

Is it still Independence Day weekend? Or, was that last weekend? I never know, when the 4th of July falls during the week. Either way, I suppose every day should be a day to celebrate the gift of freedom and democracy ... even when it gets

down-right weird in our country! However, after all these years, I just learned that Charles Carroll of Carrollton, Maryland, the last signer of the Declaration of Independence (August 2, 1776) and the last signer to die (November 14, 1832), was the *only Catholic* to sign it! Apparently, his grandfather (Charles Carroll) emigrated from England to Maryland in 1688, because of the persecution of Catholics. His grandfather, then, obtained considerable grants of land and was made attorney-general under the third Lord Baltimore. So, when Charles of Carrollton signed in 1776, he had the most to risk because he was the wealthiest man in the colonies, having amassed a fortune of \$2 million by the time our country received its freedom. That would be worth \$57.7 billion in today's dollars! We wouldn't need to raffle off a Mercedes if someone from St. Jude's had that kind of change on hand!

We find ourselves now in the 14th Week of Ordinary Time. Luke tells us that Jesus said to those 72 disciples, as He sent them forth: "*The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few.*" The "harvest" that He was referring to was not going to be all the things that they will do on their journey: the amount of healing they were able to do, or the number of demons that they will expel. "*The Harvest*" that Jesus was emphasizing – the one that He sent them out to "bring in", so to speak – is the larger, more abundant harvest of the Kingdom of Heaven. "*Go out, everyone, and bring My Father's Kingdom to His people! Go out, and make them know ... teach them, heal them, love them ... so that they will know that Heaven awaits them! The Harvest is real! The Harvest is true! The Harvest is theirs if they truly want it!! Then, Gang, show them how to go and get it! The Kingdom of God is at hand!! But, remember, rejoice not so much at the wonderful things that you did, as much as you should rejoice that your names are written in Heaven!*" Luke doesn't record exactly what happened during the days that those 72 went out as Jesus sent them. All that he says is "*The 72 returned rejoicing!*" Those must've been wonderful days. As each & every one of us looks back on the years that we have been given ... all these years that we have committed ourselves to following the Gospel of Jesus Christ ... *where is the rejoicing? Is there any rejoicing?* Now, we all know, and so did they, these years are not a constant celebration, by any means. And, some people even experience the pain and suffering of 5 lifetimes. But, even so, have we been living in such a way that we are confident that our names are written in Heaven? With all the good and all the bad in my life, am I pleasing God? Are

there others who are experiencing God's love because of me? Has anyone ever felt peace – God's peace – because of my presence in their life? Those who have been blessed with so much can do some wonderful things in this life. Those who have absolutely nothing can do the very same thing with what God has given to them. So, then ...what have I done? What can I *still* do to assure that my name is written in Heaven?

On TUESDAY EVENING, JULY 16TH, at 7:00, right after the 6:30 Mass, I want to host "An Evening with the Pastor" ... and idea I stole from Fr. Jerry Ritchie out at Our Lady of Mercy in Harborcreek. Whoever is interested, join me in the Parish Center for a chance for us to come together, and ask about whatever you want to talk about, and I will try my best to answer your questions. Maybe you have some questions about the teaching of the Gospels or church doctrine ... or something about the school or parish ... or what is happening in our world. I am not looking for a "townhall meeting" to air complaints! Fr. Ritchie brings people together for an evening just to chat and "ask Father about what is on your mind." I was intrigued by that! And, I thought you may enjoy the opportunity to do that, as well. I will not have all the answers! (Although, I can be very good at making them up!) But, let's try one to see how it goes, and maybe we can do this a few times a year.

We are taking the Mercedes to the Northeast Cherry Festival this week. That is one of the best festivals in the county! We will be needing people to spend a few hours selling tickets on the Mercedes for us. If you are retired, or have some extra time, we really need your help. All we need is a few hours of your time. I believe there are sign-up sheets in the back of Church. Or, once you check your schedule at home, just contact the office (833-0927), and we will let you know what slots are still available. Thank you so much for your help! You will have a great time!

Thank you to Fr. Shane for covering the Sunday Masses this weekend. I was asked to cover for Fr. Bill O'Brien at St. Callistus Church in Kane, as he recovers from recent surgery. It is getting more difficult for our priests to find coverage while they are on retreat, vacation, or recuperating. I think it is necessary for our Erie priests to help our men down in the Diocese who do not have anyone to cover for them. From there, I will be attending the annual San Alfonso Clergy Institute for Priests in Long Branch, New Jersey. I really look forward to this week, where several priests gather for a chance to get out of our offices and spend some time in great conferences. I will see you all when I get back!





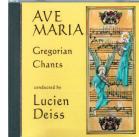
