From the desk of the Pastor

The last Sunday that I wore green vestments was March 3rd, a few days before Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of Lent. The past two Sundays, the Feasts of the Holy Trinity & Corpus Christi, are in the season of Ordinary

Time. Now, we begin the 13th Sunday of Ordinary Time, and we return to the Gospel of Luke. And, in today's passage, Luke's Gospel enters into the final section where Jesus begins His journey to Jerusalem ... He begins His journey to His death ... a journey that will, ultimately, lead to His Ascension to the Kingdom of His Father. Luke wants his readers to come to realize that Jerusalem is *not* so much a place of death or "ending" ... as much as it is a "stepping stone" to *life and eternal Glory!* Jesus sends His disciples out ahead of Him, to prepare the people for His coming, where He is resurrecting the role of John the Baptist a bit. But, these disciples show that they are not in full understanding of what Jesus is all about, or even, who He really is: they want Jesus to bring down fire to destroy those who will not accept, completely unlike the fire of *faith, hope, and love* that John wanted to bring down upon those who don't believe. The closer Jesus gets to Jerusalem ... the closer He gets to His death, His Resurrection, AND His Ascension into Glory ... the more He is challenging those who "claim" to be His followers – the more He is challenging them to fully understand ... *and, accept* ... what is required of them. As we continue through Ordinary Time, let us accept the challenge to truly understand exactly what is expected of us, the "New Apostles", in these most difficult of times. What is the Lord Jesus asking of each one of us?

As I write this, I have just completed a long day spent with about 14 of our young people doing some great "missionary" work with Jesse Spanogle, our Director of Faith Formation. Several groups spent this week, and the past few, down at the Villa Maria Education & Spirituality Center just below Sharon, the home of the Sisters of the Humility of Mary. We spent half the day preparing the daily meal, and serving 300 dinners at The St. Vincent DePaul Center in Youngstown, Ohio, within a few miles of Villa Maria Center. It was heartwarming to see our young people really enjoy preparing the meals and the dining room. It was very humbling for them to see so many people come in: a lady all alone, who is close to 90 years old ... several people who were working, but still couldn't afford to take care of themselves ... several people with obvious mental illness ... and, several families with small children. I was so proud of our kids, for they treated *them all* with such dignity and respect. But, I do believe that their eyes were truly opened, and came to understand the magnitude of deep

poverty; especially, as they saw those little children in the food line. When we returned, we went right to work helping to clean up and landscape the Sister's property. And, these kids worked hard! I stopped counting how many hedges I cut! But, the gang was right near me cleaning up the clippings ... raking out all the old leaves out from under the hedges ...and, all kinds of things. It was a busy, hard-working day, and it is not over! (I just snuck out to prepare this before the printing deadline.) I am heading back over to the kids for late night confessions!

Our intent is that you shall have your tickets on the 2019 Mercedes AMG C43 Cabriolet this weekend! We are keeping the tickets at the same prices as before: **\$10 each ... 4/\$20 ... 12/\$50 ... 30/\$100 ... 120/\$300 ... 500/\$1000.** We have plenty of tickets, so if you need more, just say so! Remember, too, that you have the option of taking **\$40,000 in CASH**, instead of the car. This has become our "signature" fundraiser, so we are really hoping to increase the amount of parishioners who buy or sell their tickets. In previous years, about half of our parishioners do that. We are really hoping that the other half can help out! All proceeds from the Mercedes raffle goes towards the operating expenses of the parish, helping us pay all the taxes and insurance premiums, air-conditioning and heating costs, to say nothing about the \$330, 000 Catholic education assessment. So, we could use everyone's help! And, put out a word about it through all your social media: **WW.WINTHISBENZ.COM!!!**

This week is the great celebration of our American Independence. With that in mind, allow me to share with you some challenging words spoken by Pope Francis, as he appeared before the Congress of the United States, in September of 2015: *"This (Golden) Rule points us in a clear direction. Let us treat others with the same passion and compassion with which we want to be treated. Let us seek for others the same possibilities which we seek for ourselves. Let us help others to grow, as we would like to be helped ourselves. In a word, if we want security, let us give security; if we want life, let us give life; if we want opportunities, let us provide opportunities. The yardstick we use for others will be the yardstick which time will use for us. The Golden Rule also reminds us of our responsibility to protect and defend human life at every stage of its development."*




St. Jude 31 Club Praying for vocations every day of the year!






