From the desk of the Pastor

Only one more week to go until the “Serafini’s Spaghetti Dinner”, where we will raffle off the 2018 ROUSH Mustang “Stage 2”! Remember, the winner of the car could take the \$40,000 Cash option

instead! There’s only a few more days to go to sell or buy as many tickets as you can! I still feel like I arrived as Pastor of St. Jude’s only a few weeks ago. But, then I shake my head, and realize that this is the 7th Serafini’s Spaghetti Dinner! We can always use more volunteers for next weekend, so just get ahold of Jen Hudson, our Parish Administrative Assistant, and she will take it from there! Jen, Matt Costa, Sue & Steve Drabant and their team have been working hard getting all the preparations ready. There are lots of people helping! Patty Shaughnessy and her uncle, Dominic Carmosino, are getting ready to get their group to start rolling meatballs from scratch! It is really hard to find better meatballs than these! If these past 7 years have told us anything, we are preparing for about 1200 people to come through our doors. And, don’t forget, that there will be take-outs available, too! There is still time to donate a theme basket to be raffled off, as well. There’s still lots to do, but everyone is looking forward to a great weekend! Keep selling those tickets!!

I feel terrible that I completely forgot about the joy of last Sunday: Pope Francis canonized 7 new saints, including Saint Pope Paul VI and Saint Oscar Romero! What an astounding day for Church! (And, I didn’t remember it until Monday!!) Saint Pope Paul VI (Giovanni Battista Montini ... 1897-1978) has been a powerful influence on our modern Church, seeing through the completion of the Second Vatican Council, ushering in so much of the Church’s tradition and teachings into the modern times. Saint Oscar Romero (1917-1980), the murdered Archbishop of San Salvador who spoke up for the poor and the oppressed, was canonized as a “martyr”. He had been gunned down by a death squad at the altar, while presiding at Mass in 1980. Pope Francis also canonized Francesco Spinelli (1853-1913), a diocesan priest, founder of the Institute of the Sisters Adorers of the Blessed Sacrament; Vincenzo Romano (1751-1831) a diocesan priest; Maria Katharina Kasper (1820-1898), a virgin & founder of the Institute of the Poor Handmaids of Jesus Christ; Nazaria Ignazia of Saint Teresa of Jesus (1889-1943), a virgin & founder of the Congregation of the *Misioneras Cruzadas de la Iglesia*; and, Nunzio Sulprizio (1817-1836), a layperson. I understand that, during

the Canonization Mass, Pope Francis used the chalice of St. Pope Paul VI, and wore the bloodied-cincture (rope) that St. Oscar Romero was wearing when he was murdered. What a powerful ceremony that must’ve been last Sunday! 60,000 were gathered at the Vatican to witness this historic ceremony, while thousands gathered in Gerardo Barrios Square in San Salvador to watch it live on big screens. In his homily during the Mass, Pope Francis said, “*Jesus is radical. He gives all and he asks all: he gives a love that is total and asks for an undivided heart.*”

I am not sure if anyone remembered, but this past Tuesday was the 40th anniversary of the election of Pope John Paul II as the Vicar of Christ! 1978 was the “Year of the Three Popes”. Saint Pope Paul VI died on August 6th, which brought forth the 33-day episcopacy of Pope John Paul I. I remember him very clearly, for Albino Luciani was introduced to the world as a very pious & holy man, with such a peaceful face. He was known to ride his bicycle quite a bit as the Cardinal Archbishop of Venice. He was the first Pope born in the 20th Century, and was also the first Pope to take a double name, “Pope John Paul” ... which was to give honor to the two previous Popes whom he deeply loved: Saint Pope John XXIII and now-Saint Paul VI. But, he also had one of the shortest papacies in history, lasting only 33-days. I will never forget coming to breakfast that morning, and my mother telling my brothers and I that the Pope died. And, nonchalantly, we told her, “*We know ... a month ago.*” And, she told us, “*Not him! The new one!*” But, the shock continued a few weeks later when the bells of St. Peter’s Basilica rang out again, and we learned that the new Pope was only 58 years old, and was from Poland!! I was in junior-year history class at Prep with the late Sister Loretta McHale, who started screaming as then-Assistant Headmaster Fr. Bill Biebel proclaimed it in Latin over the P.A. system! (Sr. Loretta, obviously, was the only one in the room who could speak fluent Latin!) I will never forget one of Pope John Paul II’s first visits was to an American Youth Rally in Madison Square Gardens during the spring of 1979. He took New York by storm! A delegation of students presented him a pair of sneakers, some American rock music, and a tee-shirt, I believe ... symbols of youth culture for that time. I was always so amazed at how energized Saint Pope John Paul II got whenever he attended a youth rally. I got to see it and experience it myself in Denver in 1993. Looking back on my last 30 years as a priest, that World Youth Day was among the most powerful experiences I have ever had. We all have so much to learn from and about our new saints. FORMED.org is a great resource,

with some well-done videos about St. Pope Paul VI. And, there is a great resource in "Catholic News Service" (catholicnews.com), as well. I am looking forward to learning more about the new saints! Nunzio Sulprizio was only 19 years old!

Looking forward to seeing everyone next weekend

for the best Spaghetti Dinner in Northwest Pennsylvania! One of you could be taking home a new ROUSH Mustang, too! It's happened 3 times already!! Have a great week! Sell those tickets!

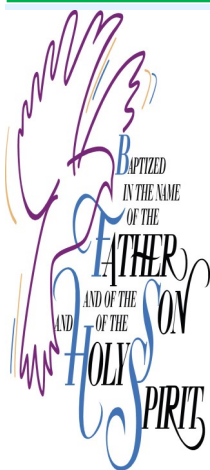

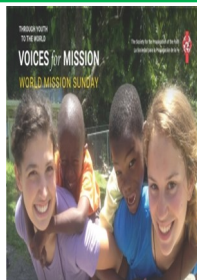
St. Jude 31 Club Praying for vocations every day of the year!

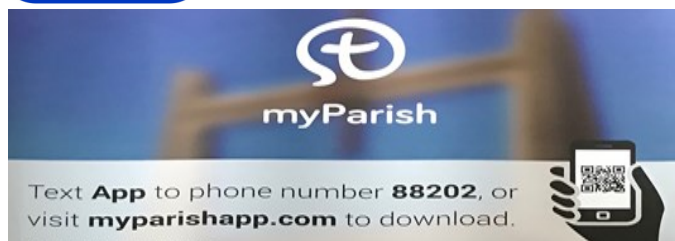

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments:**Bullying Prevention Month:**

Relational bullying is unwarranted, persistent, unwelcome behavior in the form of criticism, isolation, or fabricated allegations that can damage relationships. Examples include social exclusion ("You can't be with us"), spreading rumors ("Did you hear...?"), and withholding friendship ("I won't be your friend if you..."). Though relational bullying can often seem ambiguous to outside observers and often garners less attention than physical bullying or verbal bullying, it should not be discounted simply as normal, adolescent behavior. In fact, several recent studies suggest relational bullying is more strongly related to emotional distress and teen depression than any other form of bullying. 


