Deacon's Corner

September 26, 2021

This week on Oct. 2_{M} , is the memorial of the Guardian Angels. In keeping with this week's faith formation theme, I thought we could take a closer look at guardian angels.

In the National Catholic Register, there is an article titled, "8 Things to Know and Share About the Guardian Angels."

- 1. What is a guardian angel?
- A non-human, non-corporal being (having no material body or form).
- Assigned to guard a particular person and help them avoid spiritual dangers and achieve salvation.
- May also help a person avoid physical dangers if that would help a person achieve salvation.
- 2. Where do we read about guardian angels in Scripture?
- In the Gospels, Jesus indicates that there are guardian angels for every individual, including little children. (Matt. 18:10)
- 3. What does Jesus mean when he says these angels "always behold" the fact of the Father?
- There is the idea that angels are messengers (in Greek *angelos = messenger*).
- Angels may be in the heavenly court presenting the needs of their charges to God.
- 4. What does the Church teach about guardian angels?
- From the Catechism of the Catholic Church: "From its beginning until death, human life is surrounded by their watchful care and intercession. Beside each believer stands an angel as protector and shepherd leading him to life. Already here on earth, the Christian life shares by faith in the blessed company of angels and men united in God." (CCC 336)
- 5. Who has guardian angels?
- The Catechism of the Catholic Church speaks of "each believer" having a guardian angel.
- 6. How can we thank them for the help they give us?
- We can give thanks for the serenity and confidence they provide under challenging situations.
- Among the prayers to the Guardian Angel is the Angele Dei.
- The Angele Dei can be part of a family's morning or evening prayers.
- 7. Should we assign names to our guardian angels?
- The practice of assigning names to the Holy Angels should be discouraged, except in the cases of Gabriel, Raphael, and Michael whose names are contained in Holy Scripture.
- 8. What is the *Angele Dei prayer*?

Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's love commits me here, ever this day, be at my side, to light and guard, rule and guide.

Amen.

I hope this helps with some of the many questions you may have about Guardian Angels.
