Deacon's Corner

July 31, 2022

I have a wonderful book, *A Year with the Church Fathers* by Mike Aquilina. There is a reading and reflection for each day from one of the Church Fathers. The first questions one asks typically are who were these men, and what did they do to earn the title?

Catholic Answers says:

"The Fathers of the Church are so called because of their leadership in the early Church, especially in defending, expounding, and developing Catholic doctrines. For the first two centuries, most of these men were bishops, although in later years certain priests and deacons were also recognized as Fathers.

The list includes such notables as: Clement of Rome (d. A.D. 97), Ignatius (d. 110), Polycarp (d. 155), Justin Martyr (the Church's first major lay apologist; d. 165), Irenaeus (d. 202), Cyprian (d. 258), Athanasius (d. 373), Basil (d. 379), Cyril of Jerusalem (d. 386), Ambrose (d. 397), John Chrysostom (d. 407), Jerome (d. 420), Augustine (d. 430), Cyril of Alexandria (d. 444), Pope Leo the Great (d. 461), and Pope Gregory the Great (d. 604).

The Church demands four major characteristics to be exhibited in the life and works of an early Church leader if he is to be considered a Father of the Church. These are antiquity, meaning that he lived before the eighth century (the death of St. John Damascene [cir. A.D. 750] is generally regarded as the close of the age of the Fathers); doc-trinal orthodoxy; personal sanctity; and approval by the Church."

A recent example of a reflection that I read comes from a homily by St. John Chrysostom: "Some things are morally good by nature; others the opposite; and still others neither good or evil, but in a middle position. Piety is a good thing by nature, and impiety is evil. Virtue is a good thing by nature, and wickedness is evil.

But wealth and poverty are neither good nor evil in themselves. They become either good or evil from the will of those who use them.

If you use your wealth for the purposes of philanthropy, the thing becomes the foundation of good. But if you use it for robbery and greed and insolence, you turn the use of it to the direct opposite.

The same is true of poverty. If you bear it nobly by giving thanks to the Master, what has happened becomes a cause of your winning crowns. But if because of your poverty you blaspheme the Creator, and accuse him for his providence, then you are using the thing for an evil purpose."

This homily should prompt us to consider the question "What good have I made using God's gifts to me today?"
