#### **CHOOSE LIFE!**

In the verses before today's Gospel, Jesus has just chosen his twelve apostles and is coming down the mountain with them. Accompanying them is a large crowd. The people are all jostling to get close to Jesus because they have heard of his miraculous powers. Some have already been cured of unclean spirits and diseases and the rest want to touch him and be healed. Never has there been a more captive audience. It is the perfect setting for one of Jesus' most often-quoted and charismatic sermons.

#### THE GREAT DISCOURSE

If we can place ourselves on that plain at midday, part of the large crowd surrounding Jesus and the apostles, we may feel some of the excitement and anticipation that they must have felt. Imagine reaching out your hand to touch his cloak. Look into his eyes and sense his energy and his compassion. Hear him speak the words that you know by heart, for the first time.

Like the apostles and the crowd on the plain, we are also commissioned in the Beatitudes to choose life. By our baptism, we are given the choice of being that tree whose "leaves stay green" and that "fears not the heat when it comes," for the heat will surely come if we choose this path. If we "[delight] in the law of the LORD" (Psalm 1:2), we will be able to withstand life's dry spells and still remain fruitful, and our fruits will be savored long after we have "fallen asleep in Christ" (1 Corinthians 15:18).

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends in Christ:

1. Eucharistic Ministry Training session will be next Sunday, February 24, following 10:00 Mass at St. Lawrence. People who choose to help with this liturgical ministry from either parish are welcome at the session.

2. Lector Ministry Training session will be Sunday, March 3, following 10:00 Mass at St. Lawrence. This session is open to all from both parishes who choose to help with this liturgical ministry.

3. In only two weeks, we will be starting our Lent Season. Give serious and prayerful thought about how 'this' Lent can become a real, personal journey of faith for you. I might suggest:

A. Join the adult education discussion group on Tuesday evenings from 7:00 to 8:00. During Lent we will read and discuss <u>"The Shack,"</u> a thoughtful spiritual book that has captured the attention of many believers over the past several years. It provokes the reader to 'think more clearly' about faith, imagery, and personal practice at different points in our lives. Complacency is shaken by tragedy that converges on an evil-spirited man and an innocent child, leaving anguish and chaos in its wake. Time only seems to stand still, and God is certainly not done with us yet, but He is retooling us to mature in faith, to suffer meaningfully, and to emerge as people of hope in resolution. The question is what our choice will be in the process and in the outcome.

B. Participate actively in Adoration, Penance, Stations of the Cross and Benediction on Wednesday and Friday evenings. C. Have a Family Prayer Session in your home. There will be a 'guide' format prepared and available at the Church entranceway for you to take and follow at home.

D. Participate in one of the regional Penance Service Program options that are listed in our Lent Schedule for 2019.

E. Read a complete Gospel Account (Mark, Matthew, Luke, or John) in daily sections for personal prayer. Or read the Acts of the Apostles to discern the formation story of the early Church. Or read the Letters of St. John to reflect on the spirituality of Love and experience of the Holy Spirit.

Avoid distorting what could be a prayerful journey of faith through the season of Lent into a vanity trip of endurance or distracting struggle to avoid sweets, smoking, or other penitential practices. The five suggestions made above suggest being more positive and spiritual in deepening our faith and practice.

There are 'sign up sheets' in the vestibule for you to respond to the training and adult series offered for you to become more involved in the spiritual life of our parish.
