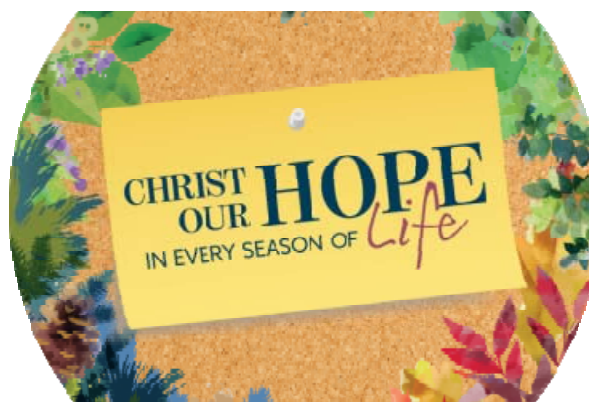


Twenty Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

GIVING THANKS

We who have received so much healing through Christ should devote our lives to giving God thanks and praise. All of us were “foreigners” until we were baptized. None of us deserves God’s daily mercy and care. And it is through our public expressions of thanks for God’s grace in our lives that others come to know the saving power of Jesus Christ. Thus, public thanksgiving is central to the life of Christian discipleship.

The Eucharist is our primary means of giving public praise and thanks to God. Together we give thanks for the gifts of creation and the covenant. We give thanks for the gift of salvation that is ours through Jesus Christ and for the gifts of abundant life, unity, and healing that the Holy Spirit continually pours out on us. During the Eucharist we also “sing joyfully to the LORD” (Psalm 98:4) in thanksgiving for the daily gifts of God in each of our lives. In the words that we say before every Eucharistic Prayer, “It is right to give [God] thanks and praise.”

Pastor's Desk**



Dear Friends in Christ:

1. There is no clear reason given in scripture ‘why’ the other 9 who were cured failed to return to Jesus to ‘give thanks.’ Perhaps they were caught up in *fear*. “If He can cure this terrible disease, we’d better literally obey Him lest He inflict a more severe disease upon us!” Perhaps they were more interested in moving on – to get the ‘official’ cleansing document from the priests in the Temple ‘so that’ they could then return to their families and local communities with documents of being cleansed and no longer to be shunned.

What was emphasized is that the Samaritan, one used to being prejudiced against, had the bravery and total sense of gratitude to ‘break tradition’ and return to Jesus, humbly, gratefully, and personally to give thanks. God was honored. A role model of gratitude was given to the Community of Faith to move beyond stiff functionalism and to embrace the warmth of relationship over ‘law’.

Are you spiritually free enough to do likewise?

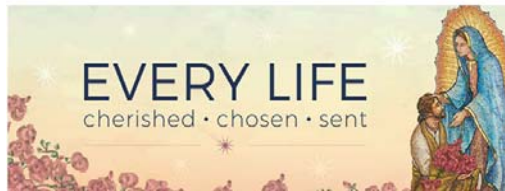

As you know, Gracie has been diagnosed with kidney disease. She takes 3x daily subcutaneous Vet. Lactase Solution for dehydration, 2x daily Aluminum Hydroxide mouth infusion, 2x daily medication to help her clear her blood from toxins. Like most patients, she doesn't like the prescribed nutrition and can't look forward to steak, prime rib, pork chops or Arby's roast beef again! Who knew that feeding dogs meat would damage their kidneys?

I didn't know there was a 'silent appeal' for people to donate towards her care, but I do appreciate the generosity of a lot of people from St. Philip and St. Lawrence who helped as they are able. Today, I deposit about \$1350 towards her treatment. I'm sure she 'feels the love' that is behind each donor's heart and prayers for her health. As an 8 year old, she already has 'white-hair syndrome' probably because her special friend suffers from that as well.
