Our Lord Jesus Christ the King

SAVE US

If there is disbelief about the cross being the source of all salvation, reconciliation, and peace, it is eradicated in the Letter to the Colossians. Christ, in whom the fullness of all things dwells, the firstborn of all creation, is also the firstborn from the dead, and it is the blood of his cross that flows with the eternal life of heaven.

In Roman crucifixion, crosses had little plank seats upon which the bodies of the crucified were propped. Their bodies, growing heavy with weakening and dying, would likely fall off without this seat. This seat, propping up the body of Jesus as it gasped for its final breaths, is the royal seat of our Savior and King. For us, he sat upon that most horrid throne. Like us, Jesus would agree that you have to look out for "number one." The difference is that at the words "number one" he wouldn't jab a jaunty thumb at his own chest. He'd extend a loving embrace between earth and heaven for each of us, the children of earth, the little ones in whom his own face shines. The rulers, the soldiers, one of the criminals, all were skeptical about the saving power of our King, because he would not-and they presumed could not—save himself. What this King shows all of us is that God's power is to save us, to remember us in his kingdom, to take us with him to the light of Paradise.

ALERT:

1. I am happy to note that within the next few weeks, we will be looking into having power openers installed for each of the East Side entrance doors to St. Lawrence church vestibule. In addition, we are having specialists review the South Street Main Entrance for window repair or replacement for the pane that has been fogged for years because of a broken seal.

2. Specialists will monitor and assess our public speaking system for both churches on Wednesday morning. They will identify where 'dead spots' are and reconfigure the speakers to cover those sites more clearly. They will set the volume and tone adjustments for their optimum setting as well.

3. To facilitate participation in Communion Hymns at St. Lawrence Parish, the musicians and choir will initiate the hymn immediately after the Lector announces it and the celebrant receives communion. They will continue the hymn until the communion lines are <u>almost</u> completed and then will finish the ongoing verse and a period of silence will begin. The musicians and choir will then receive communion and they and the congregation will have a few minutes of private, silent, thanksgiving prayer.


The celebrant will then stand and invite all to pray and will say the 'Final Prayer.' <u>After</u> that, the Lector will make announcements and call your attention to the Final, Concluding hymn which will begin immediately following the Final Blessing and Dismissal.
