

### Deacon's Corner

October 23, 2022

Saint Anthony Mary Claret

On October 24<sup>th</sup>, the Church celebrates the feast day of St. Anthony Mary Claret, the founder of the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Also, the Missionary Sons were known as the Claretians. How appropriate his feast day is celebrated during October since he was influential in propagating Marian devotion during his lifetime.

Anthony was a man of many talents – a missionary, religious founder, social reformer, queen's chaplain, writer and publisher, archbishop, and refugee. His work took him to the Canary Islands, Cuba, Madrid, Paris, and the First Vatican Council.

He was born in Spain in 1807 and started his career as a weaver and printer. Anthony's keen intellectual curiosity motivated him to become fluent in Latin. He was ordained as a priest in 1835 and remained in Spain for the first 10 years after ordination due to poor health. In 1850, Anthony was appointed to head the much-neglected archdiocese of Santiago in Cuba. He began its reform by almost constant preaching and hearing confessions. Also, Anthony suffered bitter opposition, mainly for opposing concubinage and providing instruction to black slaves. In addition, his solution for the misery of Cubans was family-owned farms, producing a variety of foods for the family's needs instead of being dedicated to the single cash crop of sugar. This was not a very popular idea, and Anthony suffered a barrage of ugly slanders and 14 attempts on his life.

Eventually, Anthony was recalled to Spain to serve as the chaplain for Queen Isabella II under the conditions that he would reside away from the palace, come only to hear the queen's confession, instruct the children, and be exempt from court functions. During the Spanish Revolution of 1868, he fled to Paris with the queen's party. He would never return to Spain and passed away at a Cistercian monastery in France in 1870.

The Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC, honors St. Anthony in the St. Anthony Mary Claret Chapel, which is adjacent to the Immaculate Heart of Mary Chapel. On the west wall is a prayer composed by St. Anthony reflecting his devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary:

"O Heart of Mary, furnace and instrument of love, enkindle me with love of God and my neighbor."

St. Anthony Mary Claret, pray for us and help us increase our devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

In honor of National Eucharistic Revival, St. Lawrence Church will host a presentation by Dr. Jaci Phillipson "Eucharistic Miracles". This free event will take place on Sunday, November 13th at 11am, at St. Lawrence Church. Join us and please bring family and friends who would like to hear the evidence of miracles and increase their belief in the True Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist!



Holy Hours are the Roman Catholic devotional tradition of spending an hour in Eucharistic Adoration in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

We are lucky to have a Holy Hour with Exposition and Benediction, each Tuesday at 6pm at St. Lawrence Church. If you have never gone to a Holy Hour, and are not sure what it is or what to do, here is a little of what you can expect, and there are booklets there, to follow along.

Fr. enters and goes to the Tabernacle, removes the Blessed Sacrament, brings it to the Altar, and places it in the Monstrance which is on the Altar. He then kneels before the altar and incenses the Holy Eucharist.

A Communal Prayer follows, usually The Chaplet of Divine Mercy, which is lead by Fr.

30- 40 minutes of silent, personal prayer is then observed.

Benediction follows with prayers, and song.

Come and join us in the wonderful experience that will bring you closer to Our Heavenly Father.
