Deacon's Corner

July 10, 2022

I recently read the book *American and Catholic* by C. Walker Gollar. It covers the timeframe of the first European explorers up to the twenty-first century. Again this week, I would like to spend some time with the story of a saint from seventeenth-century North America. Learning about the lives of the saints, we hear about the people who build the Church and spread the faith. In addition, we can visit and walk on many of the sites where North American saints lived and witnessed to their deep faith.

This week on July 14th, the Church celebrates Saint Kateri Tekakwitha. Her mother was a Christen Algonquin taken captive by the Iroquois and given as wife to the chief of the Mohawk clan. Kateri Tekakwitha was born in 1656 in the Mohawk village of Ossernenon, just a few miles west of present-day Auriesville, New York. Her Mohawk name, Tekakwitha, means "she who bumps into things." Kateri was the daughter of Mohawk Chief Kenneronkwa. Her parents and brother died from a smallpox epidemic when she was only four. The young Tekakwitha survived but was left disfigured and half-blind.

In 1666, French soldiers took control of the area where Tekakwitha lived. French Jesuits followed but made little progress in converting the Iroquois people. Finally, in 1675, Father Jacques de Lamberville told nineteen-year-old Tekakwitha about the joys of heaven. For someone who had suffered so much on this earth, words of a better life beyond must have brought great consolation. On Easter Sunday, 1676, Lamberville baptized Tekakwitha. She took the name Catherine in honor of Catherine of Siena, the fourteenth-century saint the Jesuits had made popular among the native peoples. Catherine or Kateri lived a life of piety, prayer, and mortification. She died on Holy Thursday, April 1680, and the facial scarring from smallpox disappeared on this day. She was declared blessed in 1980 and was canonized in 2012.

This summer can provide a wonderful opportunity for a weekend trip to Our Lady of Martyrs – National Shrine of the North American Martyrs and birthplace of St. Kateri Tekakwitha. It can also be a restful break to walk where a saint walked.
