Deacon's Corner

June 5, 2022

Pentecost

I recently read a fascinating online article from the Catholic New Agency (CNA) on the timing, origins, customs, and meaning of Pentecost in the Church. Pentecost is one of the most important feast days of the year as it concludes the Easter season and celebrates the beginning of the Church.

Pentecost is celebrated 50 days after the Resurrection of Jesus and ten days after his Ascension into heaven. Pentecost depends on the timing of Easter and can fall between May 10th and June 13th. Mary and the Apostles prayed together “continuously” for nine days after the Ascension leading up to Pentecost. This was the first Novena or nine days of prayer of the Church. The Greek word “pentecoste” means 50th.

What happens at Pentecost? At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit comes down upon the Apostles, Mary, and the first followers of Jesus, who are gathered together in the Upper Room. Tongues of fire come to rest on their heads, and there is a strong driving wind. Those present receive the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit needed to fulfill the Great Commission of going out to all nations to preach the Gospel. Pentecost is considered the birthday of the Church since Peter, the first Pope, preaches for the first time and converts thousands of new believers.

Pentecost has some exciting customs from around the world. Again this should remind us of the universal nature of the Catholic Church. Typically, priests will wear red vestments symbolic of the tongues of fire and the burning love of God. In Britain and Ireland, it is “WhitSunday” or White Sunday with white vestments representing the Holy Spirit as a dove. Rose leaves are scattered from the ceiling of the Church to recall the miracle of the fiery tongues in Italian tradition. Trumpets are blown during Mass in France to recall the sound of the strong driving wind of the Holy Spirit.

Thus, let us each this Pentecost, take some time to reflect on the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit and the blessings of our universal Church.
