In this Sunday's Gospel Jesus tells us that the greatest law is to love God with our whole heart and soul and mind. What does it mean to love God? Certainly it means spending time together by reading and reflecting on God's holy word. It also means sharing our thoughts and feelings with God in prayer and listening for God's voice. Where do we go to be close to God? We join God's people in worship in the church, rest in God's presence in the Blessed Sacrament, discover God in the wonder of creation and the miraculous moments of daily life. What can we do to make God happy? How do we, like the Thessalonians, "serve the living and true God" (1 Thessalonians 1:9)?

### LOVE OF NEIGHBOR

The reading from Exodus makes it very clear that we serve God by serving those who are oppressed or in need. Jesus makes it more personal—we are to love our neighbors. That means those with whom we work and play and live. When we spend time with God we can't help but experience God's great love for us. And knowing that we are loved by God should make it easy to reach out in charity and justice to our neighbors both near and far away.

Thus, love of neighbor flows naturally from those who love God. We cannot truly say that we love God unless it shows in loving relationships and compassion to those in need. At the same time, we cannot maintain our love of neighbor unless we take time to drink from the wellspring of God's refreshing love.

As many have already voted and trusted that their ballots would be delivered on time and others have dropped off their ballots into the collection boxes at central sites, we strive to encourage everyone to vote with their conscience clear. Pray over your options, recognize the serious divides our country has experienced and strive to support candidates who will listen, who will understand the principles and values of our Constitution and national identity, and struggle to understand conflicting opinions to arrive at sound, positive judgments so that they can entrust those they vote for to serve our best values as a world leading country for the highest values. Too many lives have been lost, too much blood has been shed, too many values have been compromised by people 'in power' who put their own interests first and have sacrificed our national integrity in the process.

No one has the right to 'tell others how to vote' based on any 'single issue' or misuse of social influence. So no priest, no bishop, no religious affiliation has a right to coerce your vote. When they attempt to do so, it is a fundamental violation of your rights to decide for yourself. Unfortunately, rather than pointing out principles at stake, some sources of influence such as unions, management, social clubs, and even church leaders try to pressure members to vote in specific ways. Resist these 'pretenders' and whether you choose to support one or another candidate, let it be your own 'informed decision' and vote with a clear conscience.

It's too simplistic to believe that if you are 'pro-life' you need to vote for one party. The fact is, pro-life needs to be expanded to cover the significant needs people have across their life-span. Pro-life means to support birth as a 'right' of the unborn. It means to have social interventions available for those who are handicapped, those who are poor, those who have serious addiction problems, those who are unhealthy, elderly, or infirm for any reason! One opinion is that working towards these goals is socialism. That is a prejudicial falsehood. To respond to 'special needs groups' is to fulfill Jesus' recommendation of following the Beatitudes with moral conviction!

Our task in 'pro-life' is to respect the power of people to make better choices. Teach young and older people to choose to exercise moral judgments and resist sin. Choose to avoid pregnancy if you are not in a positive position to accept the fullness of parenting. Make the better choice to bring a developing fetus to full term and in trust and love, offer it to another couple to adopt who may not be able to have children of their own biologically. To truly be 'pro-choice' means to make the 'better choice' according to God's intention from the beginning.

We have to work very hard to fulfill pro-life values, to respond to the needs of people across their lifespan, to educate and sacrifice for protection of the unborn, more moral behaviors to be evident in our culture. Quick fixes and mythological thinking can only lead to more disaster and divisiveness as a culture. Everyone, in our country and in the world, deserves life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness, and we all need to prayerfully think through what that really means. Let us pray that God's grace will touch the hearts of people who are struggling with 'hard choices.' Disposing of millions of babies because of our choice to avoid responsibility to care for those lives is totally and completely wrong! There will be a price to pay for such reckless disregard! To <u>avoid</u> taking care of one another throughout our lifespan is totally and completely wrong! The evidence of so many homeless striving to eat and struggling for warmth in our cities is completely wrong! Loneliness in nursing homes, care centers, hospitals can be alleviated by charitable missionary visitations from parishes who do outreach programs.

Are we committed to designing ministry opportunities to save lives, touch the hearts of broken people, and give hope to the lonely? These are ways to fulfill Jesus' Beatitudes. Vote wisely!!


