From the Pastor's Desk

The Wedding Feast at Cana is a strange story to make into Sacred Scripture. It seems to be a casual event where Jesus, Mary and perhaps some of the disciples are invited to the celebration. We don't know who these celebration people are, their names are not included in the story. The casual event is that they come up short on the wine and Mary steps up to declare "They have no more wine."

Mary directs them to "Do whatever Jesus says." Without question Jesus directs them to fill the wine casks up with water and draw some for the head steward. This is behind the scenes, no one knows about the charade except the head steward. Interestingly, Mary plays a special role in this circumstance. She takes the initiative-a singular event for her. And she puts Jesus on the spot to perform a functional sign that has no redemptive value.

The miracle raises more questions than it answers. It brings a role to Mary, forcing Jesus to perform a "sign" that has no intrinsic meaning. And it demonstrates Mary's functional role as a singular event in Jesus' life. Why did this happen?

Deacon's Corner

January 16, 2022

What is Ordinary Time?

This Sunday, we enter the Ordinary Time of the Church's liturgical calendar. We should think of the liturgical calendar as the "circle of life," as Catechist Magazine describes. In other words, the cyclic nature of the liturgical calendar unfolds with Christ's life. The significance and beauty of how Christ calls us to live our lives through him come to light.

Ordinary Time is divided into two time periods. Following the Baptism of our Lord is the first period, which continues until Ash Wednesday. Pentecost Sunday starts the second period of Ordinary Time, the most extended liturgical season, continuing until Advent begins again.

Here is what the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) says: "Christmas Time and Easter Time highlight the central mysteries of the Paschal Mystery, namely, the incarnation, death on the cross, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time, on the other hand, take us through the life of Christ. This is the time of conversion. This is living the life of Christ.

Thus, Ordinary Time is a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. "

Ordinary Time is anything but ordinary. It is a time of conversion, development, and quiet growth. It comprises the longest time on the liturgical calendar when the faithful consider the fullness of Jesus' teachings and miracles while on this earth.




