Dear Friends in Christ:

Jesus received the honor of respect, and reverence, as he was welcomed into Jerusalem, riding on a jackass, cheered by the poor as being a great leader. It was a kind of comedy of respect. Jesus was riding a beast of burden in mockery of an honorable animal. Spontaneously, natives drew together as a mockery of a gathering of comical figures taking advantage of the occasion. There were several actors spontaneously acting out the charade as being one of many for people to enjoy Everyone was in a joyous mood, celebrating the Lord's Entry into Jerusalem. It was a mockery, Jesus pretended it was an exaggeration, far from authentic, but it wasn't.

In the mind of Jesus and His Disciples, they were dead-serious. In the mind of the crowd, it was serious, and comical, until it was not. The crowd reverenced Jesus and His Disciples and His mood was solemn and reverential.

Right now it's a beautiful day, with warming sun and the opportunity to enjoy the great outdoors. It's a grand Cemetery day. How long since you devoted some time to visiting the dead? To walk through lines of headstones and footstones and you recognize others who are buried closer to your mother, father, brother, sister, child, parent, etc. As you come upon the gravestone of someone you know, remember their name, and personal experiences that made up that person's life and death.

Life and death is no different today than in remote cemeteries, so long ago. Jesus was making a gesture to those who had given their lives and were buried reverentially in those days, and He respected these deaths as a faithful Jewish leader. Personally, he was taking the opportunity to symbolize His farewell through His own death and burial, keeping the details for his own death and burial to himself. He leaves his final hours for secrecy with His Disciples and a small group of dedicated followers. He sinks into the final hours dedicating His Final Meal, Eucharist, and Spiritual Farewell to His Disciples, privately, and death ritual a public farewell and final pubic gesture. Fr. Jim.

Deacon's Corner

<u>Holy Week</u>

This week starting with Palm Sunday, is Holy Week. Holy Week is the culmination of Christ's life, death, and resurrection. Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday marks the holiest week on the Church's calendar.

Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday celebrates Jesus' Triumphant Entry into Jerusalem, with the crowds shouting Hosanna in the Highest. We typically share that experience by holding up palm branches that are blessed at the start of Mass.

Mass of the Most Sacred Chrism - Monday

The Diocese of Erie is celebrating this Mass at St. Peter Cathedral at 2:00 pm, and it is open to anyone who would like to attend. Bishop Persico will bless the holy oils for the Diocese to use during the year. This includes the Oil of the Catechumenate, the Oil of the Infirmed, and the Sacred Chrism. After the Mass, each parish in the Diocese takes the oils back to their respective parishes.

Holy Thursday – Mass of the Lord Supper

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum—from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery. Holy Thursday starts the Easter Triduum. Holy Thursday is the commemoration of the Last Supper of Jesus Christ when He established the sacrament of Holy Communion before His arrest and crucifixion. It also commemorates His institution of the priesthood. Ultimately, Thursday's Mass ends in silence and Eucharistic Adoration.

<u>Good Friday</u>

Good Friday is the day on which Catholics commemorate the crucifixion of Jesus Christ. Traditionally, there is no Mass and no celebration of the Eucharist on Good Friday, only Communion. Good Friday also includes veneration of the Cross. The Church is usually stripped of its ornaments, the altar bare, and the door of the empty tabernacle standing open - is as if in mourning.

<u>Easter Vigil – Saturday</u>

During the day on Holy Saturday, there is no Mass. Parishes may hold services, but there is no distribution of Communion. On Holy Saturday, we remember that Jesus descended into Hell where He preached the Gospel to those who died before and opened the way to Heaven for all those who were worthy.

Furthermore, the Easter Vigil usually begins after sunset. It starts with the new fire and lighting of a new pastoral candle. The seven Old Testament readings cover salvation history from the creation of the world through God's various covenants with his people. The Easter Vigil is the celebration of Christ's Resurrection and the culmination of our salvation.

I hope this deacon's corner helps you prepare to celebrate Holy Week celebrating the greatest gift of salvation we have ever received - the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.


