

#### LIVING AS CHILDREN OF THE LIGHT

After the man born blind was healed, he could have done any number of things. He could have used his newly-received sight for good or for ill, or he could have just said "thanks" and gone on his way. When we receive the light of Christ in baptism, as well as God's anointing Spirit (as does David in today's first reading), we join the community of faith that professes Jesus Christ as the Light from Light, true God from true God. We are part of the Body of Christ—the church—who glorify God and worship Christ, as does the man born blind today. But we are called upon to do more. Ephesians tells us that we, who were blind but now see, are called to live, day by day, as children of that light. We don't just say "thanks" for our baptism. Rather, our vocation is to live out that thanks by doing deeds of light, by spreading the gospel of the joy, justice, beauty, and peace we find in Jesus. This is one of the intentions of our Lenten disciplines, to help us leave behind the deeds of darkness and to live out the light of the Good News.

Dear Friends in Christ:

The 'pandemic' is bound to get worse before it gets better. Anyone who has been infected with a virus such as flu, pneumonia, or Coronavirus goes through stages of struggle with the infection. Elderly, and those with compromising pre-existing conditions

such as COPD, recent flu or pneumonia that has already compromised their immune systems need to keep free from possible infections by staying away from unnecessary human contact. Do that!

Frequent handwashing and use of hand cleanser is common sense as is the use of hand sanitizer. Keeping your hands to yourself and giving more space between you and those around you makes good sense. To crawl into your basement and sit in the dark leaves you exposed to black mold and mice... not a good option.

Common sense, sanitary precautions, following medical and science based guidelines can help to break the chain of infection and respond positively to whatever symptoms may present themselves. It's a good thing to pray to God and open yourself in trust and faith to God's Will that we 'get through' this pandemic and prepare to respond lovingly to those who are directly or indirectly affected by it.

Remember to take communion only in the hand. If you have flu symptoms or are at risk for complications if you contract any virus, then stay at home. While you are at home, remember the Lord's Day with a family rosary, novena, or sacred scripture reading and discussion about its application to your personal life as family members and Christian believers. Support each other with confidence, faith and love. Attend Mass because you truly want to worship God, express your devotion to Him within the community of faith, and receive God's blessing to share with others. Be a person of peace and hope. Fr. Jim


