### \*~\*~\*~\*~\*~\*~\*~\*\*\*\* **ROLE MODELS**

The "average" Christian has two role models in today's Gospel: Peter and the indebted servant. Peter thinks he's going to get the jump on Jesus and express his offer to be even more generous in forgiveness than he is expected to be. In a culture that was based on parity in revenge (an eye for an eye), to forgive somebody once or even twice was a generous gesture. So Peter was probably a bit self-righteously smug when he offered the biblically perfect number of seven as the amount of forgiveness he is willing to extend to another. But Jesus tells him that, no matter how good and forgiving we think we are, we need to be at least ten times more. The indebted servant hits what people in recovery programs refer to as "rock bottom" when his wife, family, and possessions are threatened. He has no choice but to fling himself on the king's mercy. It is this act of pleading, of self-recognition of his extreme indebtedness to the king, that causes the compassionate release of regal mercy to flow freely. This is how the divine throne of grace interacts with us, Jesus illustrates.

Dear Friends in Christ:

To have compassion is to have a mature sense of empathy for ourselves and for each other. It's true that some people lack basic compassion. They failed to mature through the personal developmental stages of life. Some are aggressive and pursue material gains, power over others and self-centered goals even at the cost of hurting others in the process. NPD, Narcissistic Personality Disorder is a very confined posture — is self-limiting and isolates the person emotionally from all others. Ultimately, it is a very sad way of living.

Compassion is learned by relating with others. As a child, when we scrape a knee, fail a test in school, experience rejection by peers or family, we hurt! If someone cares enough to put their hand on our shoulder and empathize with our hurt, we learn several important lessons. First, we learn that our feelings are okay to share with caring others. It gives them the opportunity to show compassion, lift our spirits and give us hope that we can do better and they are on our side to help us to succeed. "Where two or more are gathered in my name, I AM with you." Jesus' love is pure compassion and it is, indeed, very healing. If we have genuine love for others, without prejudice, we are freer and more reflective of God's love for us and for all others.

Some people do 'random acts of kindness' just for the sake of contributing goodness into the lives of strangers and they expect nothing in return. Generosity with goodness can have a positive effect that we cannot foresee. Look really carefully at the faces, the eyes of strangers and try to perceive how you could express compassion without being too assertive or aggressive.

Miguel, a paraplegic, would sit at Starbucks and sip coffee, striking up conversations with whomever he could. At some point, he would talk about the need for more compassion in our society. When the stranger in conversation became open to the idea, Miguel would offer him or her a challenge. "Look at that isolated person standing in the cold outside. How about you buying him a cup of Starbucks and pastry and then bringing it out to him/her to warm him up?" ("or a fresh lemonade and pastry to cool him down.") There are invitations for us to be more caring and 'do good' all around us every day, all day.

Conversation, recognition of a mission that could be done, invitation to actually do something positive and expect nothing back except for the experience of witnessing Compassion. How hard is it to do good and to avoid evil? Fr. Jim


