#### Dear Friends in Christ:

The theme of suffering with Christ is brought to the surface of His teaching today. By tradition we recognize that Christ's suffering is sufficient for our forgiveness of sin and bad judgment. We are saved by His grace alone! Yet, a theme of suffering with Christ comes up several times in the course of theological history. One the one hand, we can benefit from Jesus' suffering, agony and death, be forgiven and accept being welcomed into the heavenly kingdom. On the other hand, we are encouraged to identify with Jesus' suffering by accepting set-backs, disappointments and failure and remaining loyal and true to the Gospel. Not knowing which path is more correct is really frustrating at times.

The Gospel writings predict personal suffering on our part because of the poor judgment of formal authority. Jesus did not promise the disciples a happy life, he gave them a difficult path to follow. By extension, ours is just so difficult as well. Fishermen, tax collectors and others who made up the disciple group worked hard to be successful. They had to work just as hard if not harder to be successful in interacting with mankind. They were not successful by sitting back. They had to go out, communicate in pairs, and win the hearts and minds of people in foreign and homelands. They had to work, perform, and suffer in the process.

You and I are called to follow suit, nothing less. We identify with Christ's suffering, death and resurrection and we imitate the disciples and faithful in serving through our lives. Be more conscious about your Christian life. Be more alert and responsive to the small and grand design God has called you to live out. Talk with Him throughout the day and put into word and action what is truly God's will for you in all things. There are times when you will suffer to do the 'right thing' and there are times when you celebrate doing the 'right thing' even when you suffer doing it.

### Deacon's Corner

### **September 12, 2021**

This week on Monday, Sept. 13 th the Church celebrates the feast day of St. John Chrysostom. He was born in 354 AD in Antioch, which was in the Eastern Part of the Roman Empire, and died in 407 AD on his way to exile in an isolated place along the Black Sea. So why is it important to remember and celebrate a saint who lived over 1,500 years ago?

He was one of the most prolific of the Greek Fathers of the Church. His faith journey started when he set out for the desert to live the ascetic life of a hermit. His extreme mortifications left him in fragile health. After he returned to Antioch, he devoted his life to study of the Faith and became a lector, deacon, priest, and eventually the Bishop of Constantinople. Being a bishop was not a good fit for John Chrysostom. He was not a man of this world, not very political, and did not adapt to the atmosphere of the imperial court. Also, he was not very flexible when he tried to reform the morals of the clergy and courtiers.

However, John Chrysostom's true gifts were his writings; including commentaries on the Gospels and homilies. His writings have exerted significant influence over the centuries.

He was also among the greatest preachers in the history of the Church, and his name means "Golden-mouthed."

Subsequently, his trails of life, especially as an exiled Bishop, should be a reminder of our humanity and challenges when things don't always go as planned.

Lastly, here is a wonderful example of the timelessness of St. John Chrysostom's writing:

"When you are before the altar where Christ reposes, you ought no longer to think that you are amongst men; but believe that there are troops of angels and archangels standing by you, and trembling with respect before the sovereign Master of Heaven and earth. Therefore when you are in church, be there in silence, fear, and veneration."

Hope this encourages you to read and become a little more familiar with one of the many Catholic saints this week.



#### September 12

Holiness must have a philosophical and theological foundation, namely, Divine truth; otherwise it is sentimentality and emotionalism. Many would say later on, 'We want religion, but no creeds'. This is like saying we want healing, but no science of medicine; music, but no rules of music; history, but no documents. Religion is indeed a life, but it grows out of truth, not away from it. It has been said it makes no difference what you believe, it all depends on how you act. This is psychological nonsense, for a man acts out of his beliefs. Our Lord placed truth or belief in Him first; then came sanctification and good deeds. But here truth was not a vague ideal, but a Person. Truth was now lovable, because only a Person is lovable. Sanctity becomes the response the heart makes to Divine truth and its unlimited mercy to humanity.

### September 16



By refusing to admit to personal guilt, the nice people are made into scandalmongers, gossips, talebearers, and super critics, for they must project their real if unrecognized guilt to others. The, again, gives them a new illusion of goodness; the increase of faultfinding is in direct ration and proportion to the denial of sin.

## St. Lawrence Faith Formation COVID 19 Health and Safety Plan

ALL CDC guidelines will be strictly followed, including:

All classes will be in-person this year, we are not offering a Zoom option. If your child will not be attending in-person classes, St. Lawrence Faith Formation will provided you with materials to home-school their children.

- 1. If ANYONE in your household has been sick, we ask that you keep your child home. The Catechist will have a packet prepared that can be picked up, completed and returned the next week or once your household is not ill.
- 2. Each person entering the Center will be asked to use <u>hand sanitizer</u> prior to entering. Hand sanitizer will be available and used in each classroom and the bathrooms.
- 3. All children, parents and catechists will be required to <u>wear masks</u> for the entirety of Faith Formation classes. Extra masks will be available at the door and in the office.
- 4. All class rooms and the social hall will be sanitized, fogged, and set up for social distancing of 6' between individuals.
- 5. St. Lawrence will closely monitor the school systems for closures due to COVID. **<u>Do not</u>** send your child to Faith Formation if their school has closed due to COVID. St. Lawrence will provide resource materials for your child.
- 6. In the event that St. Lawrence becomes aware of a child, parent, catechist, or family that has tested positive for COVID 19 we will alert all parents of the exposure and cease in-person Faith Formation immediately until the Health Department allows us to reopen. In this instance only, Faith Formation classes will be provided via Zoom at the regular time, Sunday morning at 11:00am.
  - 10. Non-essential visitors or individuals will are strictly prohibited.

### **Building Sanitizing Procedures:**

- 1. All surfaces with be thoroughly cleaned and sanitized prior to the students and catechists arrival and after departure; including but not limited to all tables, chairs, doorknobs, bathrooms and light switches.
  - 2. All areas and rooms in the church and Center will be fogged with a sanitizing agent each week
