Dear Friends in Christ:

Jesus' message to the healed woman is "You faith has saved you." Believe! If we truly believe and actually take our issues to the correct source, our prayers will be answered. Jesus gives us that assurance. Do we truly believe? There are a lot of frustrations in our lives. We have to turn to others for a lot of solutions in the normal course of life.

I have been working a lot lately to get prepared to take a boat to my brother in Florida. I have a 25 foot pontoon boat and a 16 foot Vee-hull sport. I would like him to choose the pontoon, but I'm sure he'll take the sport. I had a hitch attached to my Jeep from U-haul. They connected the electric, but could not 'activate' it because Jeep has proprietary rights! So I had to go to Jeep. Then I made two trips to Wal-Mart to get the ball connector and the electric connector to transition from round connector on the hitch to flat connector on the trailer! Why couldn't these all be done by the same source?

Anyway, after two weeks of running around and fragmenting the hitch, I finally stopped at a dealership in Espyville and told them that I'm bringing both boats there for them to work on while I'm at retreat. I would deliver both boats really soon. Trying to mount the pontoon boat trailer onto the hitch failed miserably! I really worked at it about 30 minutes and realized I just couldn't do it. So I went back to the dealer and told him that no the pontoon boat was not invisible. I was having trouble so he came down with me to my garage. I showed him the problem, and pointed out both boats for him to have his son bring up to the service area and begin to work on them.

When I get back from retreat, I'm sure they will have them battery changed, gassed up, tried and ready for the open water! All I have to do is stay out of their way!

I'm sure there is a message about faith, prayer, community in this narrative, but I don't see it. I went to a notary to get the boat registrations and trailer registrations up to date. One trailer is mismatched with the wrong vin number in Harrisburg. The notary was very professional, pursued an answer and worked to accomplish it. Now all is ready except for the actual prepping of the boats.

Prayer =? Didn't need it because the people were very professional and did their jobs despite my imposing disposition! Faith =? Let people do their work and life really gets easier! Stay out of their way.

The woman in the Gospel story went to all the 'professionals.' She got no relief. Finally, in desperation she went to Jesus and surreptitiously touched his garment. It's like God was setting the stage over the course of her life. It's like God was demonstrating her true faith as the prompting of a final cure! It's like this was a spiritual journey from the beginning! How many spiritual journeys have you had over the course of your life – Did you recognize them? Did you come to prayer? Deacon's Corner

Have you ever thought about how others see us? There are so many ways we interact with other people throughout a typical day: at work, spending time with family, school, shopping, getting gas, sports activities, organizations and clubs we are involved with, volunteer activities, or even just passing someone as we walk the dog.

Without telling people that you are Catholic, do they see something different in us? If someone knows you are Catholic, do they ask you questions about your faith? Do we know what we believe and why about our Faith? The fancy title for talking about and defending what we believe is called Catholic Apologetics. Apologetics comes from a Greek word meaning "speaking in defense." Talking about our faith and what we believe is not a new concept. It began with the early Christian writers in the First Century who defended their beliefs against critics and recommended their faith to outsiders.

We need to learn about our Catholic Faith as much as we can to be Christ's disciples. At the end of Mark's Gospel, Jesus gives us the Great Commission, "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." (Mark 16:15)

We are quiet examples of living a Catholic life. We may be the only exposure someone has to the richness and blessing of the Catholic Church. You may never know how you touch someone's life by helping them to start thinking about Christ.

Look for opportunities this week to be examples of the Catholic faith to those we meet.


What's Happening at St. Lawrence and St. Philip
