

#### Advent

As we start the Advent season, it is significant and exciting to know more about the history and what Advent means.

It is not certain when the first celebration of Advent was introduced into the Church. In the homilies from the sixth century from St. Maximus, Bishop of Turing, and St. Caserius, Bishop of Arles, we find discussions of preparation for the birth of Christ. The Gelasian Sacramentary notes five Sundays for the preparation season. The five Sundays were later reduced to four by Pope St. Gregory VII (1073-85).

Advent comes from the Latin phrase "ad-venire" or "to come to." It is the season encompassing the four Sundays and weekdays leading up to the celebration of Christmas.

Furthermore, Advent is a season of preparation, reminding us:

<u>To Look Back</u> and reflect on the Lord's birth at Christmas <u>To Look Ahead</u> toward His second coming

The liturgical color for Advent is purple, like Lent, since both seasons are preparing us for a great feast day. In addition, Advent includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting, and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas.

This Advent season, let us remember to take some time to slow down and pray for God's peace. It also seems appropriate to contemplate that in the darkest winter season, that this is when God's "great and infinite light," Jesus Christ, came into the world.

"Come, Lord Maranatha! Come and bring us your peace. Come, Lord, Maranatha! Come to us; set us free. Come, Lord, and bring us your peace."

#### The Advent Wreath

The circle of the wreath reminds Christians of God,
His eternity and endless mercy, which has no beginning
or end. The green of the wreath speaks of the hope
that Christians have in God, the hope of newness, of
renewal, of eternal life. The four candles represent the four
weeks of Advent, and one candle is lit each Sunday.
Three of the candles are purple because the
color violet is a liturgical color that signifies
a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice.

# Oplatki Christmas Wafers

Before sitting down to Christmas Eve dinner, many families with roots in Poland and other Eastern European countries will take part in a tradition, which has roots dating back hundreds of years. Christmas Eve marks the end of Advent. Traditionally, that meant the last day of fasting, so in mostly Catholic Poland, the dinner was typically meatless. At the start of dinner, just after grace, the sharing of Oplatki, (unleavened bread) with another person is sharing all that is good with life. Many families still celebrate this tradition.

Oplatki will be available for you to purchase at St. Philip and St. Lawrence beginning next weekend, for \$3 each.
