

## Deacon's Corner

## August 7, 2022

Since Fr. Marc is away this week on a spiritual retreat, I thought it would be interesting to discuss some questions:

- What is a spiritual retreat?
- Why go on a retreat?
- Are there different types of retreats?
- Who should go on a retreat?
- How do you find a suitable retreat?

First, a retreat is taking time to step back from our daily routine of busyness and activities. It is a temporary retreat from the "world" to strengthen us for "the battle" of living our Catholic faith.

Why should we go on a retreat? Bishop Robert Reed, Auxiliary Bishop of Boston, says, "If we are doing our best at living a faith life as Catholic, we actually go on a retreat more often than we realize. Do you make an examination of conscience at the end of the day as you pray your night prayers? Do you stop by church for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament or come early to Mass for quiet time? Such moments are actually a kind of mini-retreat, withdrawing briefly from the world, putting yourself in God's presence, and assessing your own spiritual life to need to do things better."

A retreat usually has some structure with a retreat master or leader. In addition, they typically include daily Mass, Holy Hour, and a chance to go to confession. The retreat master generally is a priest that will give several talks to you and others making the retreat. Cursillo and Divine Mercy Encounter (DME) are two examples of retreats you may be aware of or have participated in that are local in the Erie Diocese.

If you are interested, there are also guided silent retreats. Right before ordination in May of 2021, my wife Joanie and I were required to attend a 4-day silent retreat. Joanie is very social and enjoys being with people. This was truly outside of her comfort zone. Our experience was wonderful and very faith-filled as we could stop and hear God's quiet voice. A silent retreat may not be for everyone, so how do you find a suitable retreat? One of the best ways is to talk with others you know who have made a retreat and enjoyed the experience. You can also talk to your pastor or other members of the parish. Don't be afraid to go to a retreat outside of your comfort zone that may allow you to grow your faith in unexpected ways.

Participating in a retreat is not just for priests, deacons, or religious orders. Prayer and discernment are also essential to hear how God may be calling you to a specific retreat. You may want to start slowly with a 1-day retreat.

Overall, this is not an exhaustive discussion of everything you would ever want to know about retreats, but hopefully, you have a good basic understanding now.

### St. Lawrence Feast Day - August 10th

Saint Lawrence, died in 258 in Rome. He was one of the most venerated Roman martyrs, celebrated for his Christian valor. It is said that Lawrence gave the church's treasures to the poor and the sick before his arrest. The saint was tied on top of an iron grill over a slow fire that roasted him. God gave him so much strength and joy that Lawrence joked with the judge saying "Turn me over". Before he died, he prayed that the city of Rome might be converted to Jesus. He prayed that the Catholic faith would spread all over the world. He is the patron saint of the poor and of cooks.
