STEWARDS OF THE VINEYARD

Isaiah's marvelous description of the vineyard reminds us of the creation passages from the book of Genesis. That description generates faint echoes of the oft-repeated line from Genesis: "and God saw how good it was" (Genesis 1:25). The sad reality is that we who are called to be good stewards of this vineyard sometimes make bad choices. Sometimes in our arrogance we fail to care for the vineyard of creation. Like the wicked tenants, we care more for our own personal gain than for the virtues of goodness and righteousness. Pope John Paul II used the term "the culture of death" to describe this kind of behavior. The parables we hear are meant to cut right to our hearts and force us to look squarely at our behaviors and attitudes. May this week's parable open our eyes to those times when we stray away from the goodness and beauty of God's vineyard and make decisions that support the culture of death. May we be strengthened in our efforts to become good stewards whose actions bring forth the fruits of life and love.

Would You Rather.... the world have more equality, more tolerance?



Dear Friends in Christ:

As Catholics, we have a valid witness to give with respect to the Church in the World. The Gospel calls 'all people' to salvation. We are the voices of truth when we speak in accord with our Church Teachings and Traditions. One special truism is the sanctity of human life! We share in the Divine Life because God chose it to be that way. Specifically, each person is an expression of God's Presence in the world because He alone created our soul and gave us life 'in his image and likeness.' In love and in duty, our responsibility is to encourage each person to be all that he and she can be, to provide for them the opportunities to succeed and to become aware of God's love for them through the way we treat them. We are, therefore, 'sent forth' by God on a mission to 'do good and avoid evil.'

In the politicization of human ambition, the current tide of name-calling, scapegoating, distorting truth, the Church needs to be better at witnessing God's Truth. ALL are created equal according to the Book of Genesis, in the 'image and likeness of God.' That is God's will! We need to respect it and reflect it with rightful pride.

In its essence, <u>abortion is fundamentally wrong</u>. That fetus is totally dependent on the parent within whom he or she is living. That dependence imposes an obligation to provide for the developing person's health and well-being. Some people miss the point by stating 'a woman has the right to determine her choice about what to do with her own body!' I don't disagree. Yet, medical people strongly recommend that a pregnant woman 'not' drink alcohol because of fetal effects. Wise women choose to abstain. Wise women choose to have a healthy diet. Wise women choose to exercise and to rest 'so that' their developing infant can have the best chance possible to develop well. The 'right to choose' is valid, as long as it applies fairly and respects the greater right of the unborn to survive.

Similarly, across the lifespan, there are critical demands for our culture to make better choices. We are able to respond to the uneducated by providing quality schools and learning experiences. We are able to reach out to the handicapped with devices, implants, therapy and a wide range of support for them to integrate as well as possible into productive societal roles with dignity and acceptance. We are able to reach out to the elderly, the fragile and damaged people with respect for their humanity to alleviate their PTSD, mental illnesses, unemployment, poverty and social crises.

To <u>respect human life</u> requires a commitment to do our best to protect and provide for all entrusted to our care. Some cynics would decry that as Socialism! What a stupid, political lie! God calls us to community, Jesus always sent his disciples out 'two by two' so that they would not be alone and vulnerable. Community IS the environment we enjoy most clearly from our creation within our mother's womb, through family, Church, culture and ultimately in the Community of Saints in Heaven! Nowhere in Sacred Scripture or Church Teaching does it allow for reckless abandonment of life. Not in the womb, not in the hospital, not in the nursing home, not in a back bedroom in a remote home in the wilderness. Our call is to respect human life and to commit to it across the whole lifespan. Take responsibility because we are clearly accountable for our actions before God who is the Author of Life!


