A DAWNING EPIPHANY

"It suddenly dawned on me!" We have all had experiences when, on hearing a joke, we laugh along with everyone else at the punch line, only at some later moment to actually "get" the joke. We feign understanding so that no one will think less of us. Having something suddenly dawn on us is very much like what we celebrate today. The Church's yearly celebration of Epiphany is a reminder and an elaboration of what we celebrated at the feast of Christmas where Saint Paul writes, "It was not made known to people in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel" (Ephesians 3:5–6).

CULTIVATING EXPECTATION

Some non-Catholics complain that our religious expression is dull and boring. They might ask, "How can you say the same prayers week after week—doesn't it just put you to sleep?" Our three-year cycle of readings, our codified prayers, and our liturgical calendar continue to repeat over and over again throughout our Catholic journey of faith. Today's feast reminds us that all along the way, epiphanies can pop up out of nowhere. A prayer or reading that washed over us last week or last year suddenly has a tremendous impact and reveals God's presence in our lives. This happens because it is we who are different each time we come to Mass. We should cultivate an attitude of expectation, just as the three magi did. They followed the star expecting to find the Savior of the world. Let us be ready to welcome the Savior today and each day of our lives.





Dear Friends in Christ:

Epiphany, "Little Sign" the Christ Child in the manger – a little sign of a great reality! If we take time to really consider the profound effect of Jesus, the Word of God, presented as a little baby, little sign of human life. Wow! What an amazing thing. Truly awe-inspiring! Awesome!

The waiter or waitress who says "Awesome" in response to your saying the meal was a tasty treat – really didn't get it. That's not awesome, the Presence of Jesus in the crib is awesome. You and I need to be tolerant of other people's commentary about what is and what is not awesome. The Epiphany is awesome – the hamburger is not.

The sign of God present among people – Awesome! The Presence of God as a child – Awesome! The hamburger on the plate – nice, tasty treat, not really worthy of much more of a consideration than any other food for the journey of life to see us to the next meal. Not awesome.

To have a personal appeal of the Christ Child as a sign of God's love and eternal promise of presence and forgiveness for our faults, truly awesome. Reserve the term awesome to what is truly worthy of awe! Give a tasty treat a commentary worthy of what it is, a tasty treat.


