HOW DO WE SPEND OUR FREE TIME?

The first reading and Gospel for today tell stories about people who want to dwell in the past. Christian freedom means that, once the past is taken care of, we move forward toward a future where we can use our freedom to love our neighbors. Too often we are barraged with advertising that tries to tell us exactly how to use our freedom. We should be spending our free time in shopping malls. We should be freely spending our money on SUVs, boats, larger and larger homes, and the biggest-screen TV. We should be spending our leisure time traveling to exotic places. Christian freedom means something quite distinct from these values, espoused by so many in our society. Today the scriptures call us to use our freedom to make this world a better place for the poor and needy. Today is one of those days when the Christian message is clear, concise, and quite easy to grasp. Putting this into practice is the challenging part for all of us.

CHRISTIAN FREEDOM

Today's second reading from the letter to the Galatians focuses on freedom. Freedom can mean different things to different people. We pride ourselves in this country on the fact that we enjoy freedom, which is guaranteed by our constitution. To be free, to some people, means that they may do whatever they please. Through baptism, Christians live in the freedom of the children of God. It is the way we use this freedom that is at the heart of the scriptures we hear today. What is central to true Christian freedom is found in today's second reading. There, Saint Paul writes that "the whole law is fulfilled in one statement, namely, You shall love your neighbor as yourself (Galatians 5:14). Freedom, in the Christian sense, has a forward-looking thrust. It is true that in baptism we are freed from sin, but there is also freedom for something. And that something is love of neighbor.

C Dear Friends in Christ:


1. When adopted and promulgated by the Liturgical authorities for Eucharist and Spiritual practices, the Holy Father's recommended 'tweaking' of the "Our Father" and other prayers will take some time to become comfortable with in our community and personal practice. At first

glance, they appear to be 'trivial translational issues.' But on closer look, they actually narrow down the range of meaning to be more specific and clarifying as a statement of Catholic Faith. We, individually and corporately, can be reactionary to change of any sort, or we can be obedient and come together as a unified community of faith and mature in spiritual practice. Make a positive choice.


2. Of several suggestions for making positive use of the large section of land on the corner of East State Street and Elk Street, a compelling option is to landscape a Labyrinth prayer site. A specifically designed geometric set of concentric but internally connected walking path would provide for a creative and prayerful demonstration of faith. It would be a destination for Prayer Groups and for individuals to 'walk the path' in prayerful meditation as they 'center' on God's Presence in their lives and souls. It is not specifically Catholic or doctrinal, but a prayerful location to open yourself to God by word, silence, music, song, walking, standing, meditating and coming to a personal 'inner peace.' There are some Labyrinths already carved into property in some sites within our diocese – and I've enjoyed the one at <u>Villa Maria Motherhouse</u> near New Castle during September retreats at that site. It is based on Notre Dame Cathedral's Labyrinth and will, hopefully, be the pattern we can use here at St. Lawrence. Enjoy the drying, sunny days of Summer now...
