

<u>The Rosary</u>

As we move through May, it is significant to remember that the Holy Rosary is a way to honor and remember Jesus' mother.

You may occasionally ask yourself, what is the background and history of the Rosary? The structure of the Rosary gradually evolved between the 12th and 15th centuries. There is a long tradition in the Church that St. Dominic de Guzman was the source of the Rosary in the 12th century to counter the Albigensians, who had denied the mystery of Christ. However, the early account of Dominic's life does not mention it, the Dominican constitutions do not link him with it, and portraits do not include it as a symbol to identify the saint.

Furthermore, the evolution of the Rosary over four hundred years is very interesting. Many scholars and theologians conclude that it is the outgrowth of the early monks saying the Psalms. The Rosary started to take form with the Our Father being said 150 times to replace the Psalms. Eventually, Carthusian monk Henry of Kalkar in 1365 divided the 150 Hail Marys into 15 groups of 10 beads. The Our Father was also placed between each group or decade. Later, around 1480, Dominican priests suggested focusing on fifteen episodes in the life and work of Mary and Jesus. From the 16th to the 21st centuries, there were 3 sets of mysteries: the Joyful, the Glorious, and the Sorrowful. In 2001 Pope St. John Paul II added the Luminous Mysteries. The intent was to include mediations on the time in Jesus' life between His incarnation (a Joyful Mystery) and His passion (a Sorrowful Mystery).

Archbishop Fulton Sheen said, "The rosary is the book of the blind, where souls see and, there enact the greatest drama of love the world has ever known; it is the book of the simple, which initiates them into mysteries and knowledge more satisfying than the education of other men; it is the book of the aged, whose eyes close upon the shadow of this world, and open on the substance of the next. The power of the rosary is beyond description."

In the book Praying the Rosary Like Never Before: Encounter the Wonder of Heaven and Earth by Edward Sri we read, "Think of the rosary as being like the ocean: There's something in it for everyone, whether you consider yourself a veteran mystic longing to go deeper in prayer with our Lord, a novice struggling to learn how to pray, or someone seeking the Lord's help, right now, with something going on in your life. The deep-sea explorer and the child making sand castles on the beach can fully enjoy the same ocean while playing at different levels. And this is true with the rosary."

So, take some time this month to pray the Rosary.

Holy Mary, pray for us during this month of the Most Holy Rosary.

Knight News- 2024 Baby Bottle Fundraiser

The Knights of Columbus in Erie and Crawford Counties are conducting our 3rd annual Baby Bottle Fundraiser. Your charitable donations thus far have enabled the Knights to purchase five state of the art Ultrasound Machines and a Mobile Ultrasound Clinic for the Women's Care Center of Erie. **Since then**, **661 babies have been born to women after they viewed their ultrasounds. They chose life for their babies even though they were originally abortion bound**.

The Women's Care Center is now facing a difficult crisis. For the past thirty years, the State of Pennsylvania allocated funds to organizations such as the Women's Care Center that promote childbirth as an option, rather than abortion by providing pregnancy and parenting support services.

The current Governor of Pennsylvania made the decision to end this program. This has caused a significant loss of funding to our Women's Care Center's Erie locations that need our financial support more than ever.

Baby bottles will be distributed at the Church entrances on Mother's Day weekend (May 11-12th). Please take one home and fill it with spare change, cash, or checks. Envelopes will also be available as an option to the Baby Bottles. The bottles and envelopes should be returned the weekend of June 22-23. We thank you in advance for your kind generosity, and pray you will once again join us in our continuing efforts in saving the lives of the unborn.
