### STANDING IDLE

Today's Gospel probably leaves those of us with a strong business sense scratching our heads in confusion. What would possess any boss to pay the same wages to a person who worked only a few minutes as someone who worked a full day? This parable calls us to dig deeper into the reality to which the story points. Consider the actions of the landowner. He goes out in search of laborers a total of five times during the day: at dawn, at nine, at twelve, at three, and at five. In this parable, Jesus summons us to consider the landowner's actions as the kind of actions our God performs. In our lives we each have moments of standing idle, like the people in today's parable. God is always on the prowl for us, inviting us into the vineyard. God's persistence is immeasurable. Whether we respond at the dawn of life or at the "five o'clock" of our lives, God's love and mercy are still showered upon us.

#### Dear Friends in Christ:

Social stratification is part of the make-up of large populations. People are divided and groups have a hierarchy according to the degree of power or authority they wield. In the military, ranking stacks authority figures who have 'earned' their status and are entrusted to give leadership accordingly. Similarly within the Church, there is a hierarchy of 'empowerment' and leadership as well. In society, people are elected to serve in various capacities and have rightful 'authority' within their range of influence and they enjoy expected respect according to the level of their position.

Class, on the other hand, refers to a 'born-into-status.' There is no earned influence. Gender, national heritage, right handedness, brown eyed, blond hair, and other 'accidental' differentiations actually make no sense in creating a hierarchy of power. The book, "Lord of the Flies" demonstrates ascribing cast/class empowerment by irrelevant characteristics. The consequence is dehumanization and severe abuse and even ritually proscribed execution. The book, "Black, Like Me" struggled to break the black-white dichotomy by naturalizing fundamental human experiences across the nationalistic boundaries that permeated American culture in the 1950's.

We are in another phase of racial injustice and abuse in our culture. We like to think of America as being a 'melting pot' of various cultural backgrounds that merge into a complementary multi-cultural multi-respectful product. But we traditionally fall short and everybody loses what could be achieved with more effort at achieving equality. We need to communicate more respectfully, try harder to embrace 'different but equal' and we need to be willing to transform ourselves more deeply.

The owner of the vineyard in today's Gospel reading failed to appreciate the underlying equality of humanity. He manipulated others and then arrogantly insulted them because of their reaction to his cavalier manipulation of others who were basically defenseless. Today, we are involved in a further evolution of social justice as represented by the BLM. Concomitantly, LBGTQ, women subordination, masculine superiority (patriarchy), economic superiority/ inferiority, left and right handedness all and many other divisive characteristics of culture limit respect expressed to human beings by human beings. Homeless, poor, addicted, unemployed, underemployed provide targets for low self-esteemed people to disparage them and sense a false ego-boost. That is a seriously *Sinful pattern of evil that must be called out because of the overall harm done to countless victims. Silence contributes to the evil.* 

Erie has identified such discrimination as a 'health issue' over a week ago. That determination offers a context within which everyone can do 'something' to make it better in a broadly positive manner. Don't be on the sidelines. Don't contribute to evil. Pray, identify some part of the solution you choose to contribute to, and be a force for good, not evil. Jesus said, "The harvest is bountiful, the workers are few." Look for ways to be more respectful of those so easily targeted because of their race, color, economics, handicaps, vulnerabilities. Make a difference in your readiness to recognize whatever form of God's people who are suffering at the hands of others. Make a difference.


