### Deacon's Corner

August 1, 2021

This week on Wednesday, August 4<sup>th</sup>, the Church remembers and celebrates St. John Vianney, the patron saint of priests.

He lived in nineteenth-century France where his meager formal schooling did not prepare him for seminary studies. John struggled with the lectures in Latin, but through a lengthy battle with the books and a private tutor, he was finally ordained. He was sent to a parish in Ars, France where he encountered people who were indifferent and quite comfortable with their style of living. His most remarkable accomplishment and gift were that of confessor, where he would spend as much as 16 hours each day providing reconciliation to those who came to him.

In June of 2019, the Erie Diocese hosted a significant relic – the incorrupt heart of St. John Vianney. As part of this celebration, my family and I attended Mass at St. Peter Cathedral and then spent some quiet time in prayer. It was a very moving experience to be able to be so close to the first-class relic of a saint. The veneration of relics in the Catholic Church is an ancient tradition going back to the first-century. This also became a teaching moment, as I was not exactly clear on what a first-class relic of a saint was?

Here are the classes of relics:

- First-Class Relics bone, hair, or tissue of a saint (like a heart).
- Second-Class Relics an item owned or used by a saint like clothing, a crucifix, rosary or a book.
- Third-Class Relics any object that has been in contact with a first- or second-class relic.

So this week we, should pray for an abundance of vocations to the holy priesthood through the intercession of St. John Vianney. We should also give thanks to those who have responded to the call to priestly ministry. Pray for all the priests in the Erie Diocese. Pray especially for Fr. Jim and his continued ministry as Pastor at St. Lawrence and St. Philip.
