

FULFILLING STATEMENTS

The Gospel of Matthew was prepared for Jews who had converted to Christianity in the early church. Therefore, much of Matthew's Gospel connects with prophecies found in readings from the Hebrew scriptures. Many of these prophecies foretold the suffering, doom, and demise of the Israelites, an often recalcitrant nation. But sometimes the prophecies pointed the people to a new vision, a new hope. It is this type of hopeful prophecy found in Isaiah today. At the time of Isaiah's words (in the mid-eighth century B.C.) the Israelites were in the grip of darkness resulting from an Assyrian conquest. The Jewish leaders had rejected Isaiah's plea for courage and faith in God. Instead they followed the pagan Assyrians. It was during this time that Isaiah foretold the coming of a Savior. The hope that Isaiah offered the people was the light brought to them by God, in the promise of the Messiah.

FOLLOWING JESUS ... THE NEW LIGHT

Matthew makes a deliberate connection between the light that shines in the darkness and Jesus, the new light that will show us the way. The Gospel author uses the reading from Isaiah to connect the people of his community to their earlier tradition so that they could walk with Jesus Christ, the new light, the new hope.

There was something urgent in the story that Matthew put down for the people. As he described the call of the first disciples, they left their nets, their boats, and their families at the summons of Jesus. Two thousand years later, we still hear the invitation and our hearts are stirred to drop all the distractions of our lives and follow Jesus. The call of Jesus leads us to a vocation. We may choose a religious life or a single life, or we may be called to marriage, but it is the way in which we live out our response that brings us out of the darkness and allows us to walk in the light.

Dear Friends in Christ:

We should not take our mission lightly. Similar to Peter, Andrew and the other disciples, we are called by God into being, permanently marked as Christians through Baptism, Confirmed and nourished by the other Sacraments to empower us to give firm, personal witness to our love for

Christ and confidence that He alone is the one, true source of Sanctifying Grace that will open our path to heaven for eternity. Do you believe this in your heart?

When you review your personal conscience in preparation for receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation, what are the 'hints' of you making personal compromises and withdrawing from witnessing the truth of faith and 'making a difference' for the better? Those moments are substance for confessing. Sins of omission are just as real as are sins of commission. And they may have long lasting effects on others who notice our shortcomings and rationalizations to justify them.

Every single one of us can do better. Similar to our Communion song, "The Lord is My Light" and he will guide us in all ways according to His Gospel. Our Opening Song, "Christ in Me Arise" is a prayerful hope that we not be obstacles of God's grace, but rather, channels of God's divine love. So, then, we can indeed, "Go, and Make a Difference" in true ministry!

We all need to reflect honestly and sincerely and respond to Jesus' invitation in today's Gospel: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." With persistence, a small tugboat can turn a massive ship along a safe course and successful docking. The many small positive things we do add up to major course changes in our lives. They can lead us closer to Christ or enable us to drift to great distances away from him and into dark waters of chaos. Sing your song of faith and be part of the harmony of salvation! Follow the 'great light' referenced by Isaiah in our First Reading at Mass. "The Lord, alone, is my light and my salvation!"



NOTICE – LENTEN PRACTICES 2020

The season of Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday, February 26, 2020, and concludes when the Paschal Triduum of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Lord begins at the start of the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening, April 9, 2020.

The following practices and regulations are promulgated and binding for all Latin Rite Catholics in the Diocese of Erie for Lent and the Paschal Triduum, 2020. Eastern Rite Catholics who may be attending Latin Rite parishes have their own proper regulations and should consult their own eparchy or parish.

- Traditional Lenten practices of PRAYER, FASTING, and ALSMGIVING, and other forms
 of self-denial, are recommended most warmly by the Church. Daily Mass is particularly
 encouraged.
- 2. **ASH WEDNESDAY, ALL FRIDAYS IN LENT,** and **GOOD FRIDAY** are days of **abstinence** from eating meat for those 14 years of age and older.
- 3. ASH WEDNESDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY are also days of <u>fasting</u> for those ages 18 to 58 inclusive. (On these days, those bound by the law of fasting may take one full meal. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength according to one's needs, are also permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or work is seriously affected, the law does not oblige.)
- 4. On **HOLY THURSDAY**, no celebration of the Mass is to begin anywhere in the diocese earlier than 4:30 pm without the express approval of Bishop Persico.
- 5. Although it does not include the Liturgy of the Eucharist, by its very nature the **GOOD FRIDAY** service is celebrated by a priest only.
- 6. All celebrations of the **EASTER VIGIL** are to begin *after nightfall* (which is defined as approximately one hour after local sunset.) Nightfall is about 9:00 pm this year. Thus, all Easter Vigil celebrations in the Diocese of Erie this year are to begin at 9:00 pm or later. However, where necessary, Bishop Persico will permit the Vigil to begin as early as 8:30 pm. Any start time earlier than 8:30 pm must receive express approval from the Bishop.
