

The Baptism of the Lord

At the beginning of Jesus' public ministry—at the moment of his baptism in the Jordan—we glimpse the love emanating from Father to Son. The Father's voice, coming from the heavens, declares that this one is his beloved son, in whom he is well pleased.

PLEASING IN GOD'S EYES

What is it that made Jesus pleasing to his Father? And what makes us pleasing to God? Perhaps the prophet Isaiah holds the key. The prophecy announced in today's first reading gives us a glimpse of the kind of person who is found pleasing in God's eyes. Too often we see these prophecies fulfilled solely in Jesus. As people baptized into Christ Jesus, we, too, can be the fulfillment of these prophecies. In baptism, we are called to be people who establish justice on the earth; we are summoned to be the light for people who are blind to the needs of others; we are charged with being the servants of God. This work is not easy. It demands the strength that comes only from a deep relationship with God. Today is the day to begin anew to grow in our love for God. Let us strive to become those who are the beloved of God, those in whom God is well pleased. This demands growth in intimacy with God, which can be nurtured each day in prayer, as well as each week when we come to Mass to offer God praise and thanksgiving.

Dear Friends in Christ:

Whether we are infants being brought forth to experience Baptism or adults or anything in between, when we receive the pouring of water or immersion in water and the Celebrant says: "I Baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit," We are changed

forever! We are from that moment forward, deeply touched by divine grace, we are christened! We are forever- more members of the Mystical Body of Christ, the Church!

As members of the Mystical Body, we have significant rights and responsibilities. We have the right to receive each of the other Sacraments in their appointed time when we are prepared to do so. We have the right to enter into God's house, our parish church, our Cathedral, every Catholic Church in the world, including the Vatican Basilica of St. Peter, because we belong there as full and active members. We symbolize this belonging and membership by dipping our hand in the holy water and blessing ourselves with it in a spiritual 'echo' of when we were immersed or baptized by pouring holy water over our heads.

Baptism and the symbolic gestures that reflect the reality of our sharing in Salvation Grace bind us together as members of the Community of Faith and true and vital members of the Mystical Body of Christ. Don't take any part of that lightly! Salvation is serious business. Be reverent, be grateful, be responsive to God's Grace in your life. Feel His Presence! Know you are loved eternally by the Author of Life and you are personally called to holiness in every way.

On this Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord, we gather in His House and Our House to pray, to worship, and to recommit to God's grace in our lives. Let us be at peace.





I am happy to call your attention to the Automatic Door Openers attached to our side entrance to St. Lawrence Church. People with walkers, wheel chairs, or using canes may be much better served with these

devices. It may take some 'getting used to' them at the outset, however, everyone will benefit from this addition. Thank you to Renae Mihalak who took point on this project in getting contractor bids and evaluating the information and to Mike Mihalak who will be making the power connections, finishing off the project.

Corporate Glass is also replacing air-seal strips along the edges of each of our Main Doors. They are also replacing the curved pane of thermal glass that has condensation building up in it as well.

We are looking for a 'handyman' who would accept the project of sanding and refinishing the large broad vestment drawers in the Vesting Sacristy. Possibly bees' wax or another lubricant would kill the large squeaking in the drawers and make them easier to open and close without raising the dead!
