"WHAT SHOULD WE DO?"

One way to discover what we should do this Advent is to pray the Our Father with extra sincerity and attentiveness. We pray, "Thy kingdom come; thy will be done." We commit ourselves to a spirit of trust and forgiveness and ask to be kept from temptation. As we get ready for the coming of Christmas it is good to ask ourselves what God's will is for us, whom we are called to forgive, and how we are tempted. What should we do so that God's kingdom might come into our lives more fully this Christmas?

How would John the Baptist reply to us if we asked him, "What should we do?"

"THE LORD IS IN YOUR MIDST"

Both today's reading from Zephaniah and the responsorial psalm exult that "the LORD is in your midst." They proclaim the presence of God among the people of Israel and foretell the core of our faith in the Incarnation. God is not far off. God's love was manifested in Jesus' coming as a human person and is present here and now in us. John the Baptist also proclaims the coming of Christ into our midst and reminds us that our lives must change if we are to be ready to welcome the Messiah at his coming.

These scriptures are not unlike the bells that seem to surround us at this time of year. They call us to rejoice. They call us to worship. And they call us to change. One bell in particular, the Salvation Army bell, reminds us that not everyone has experienced God's saving presence yet. There are many who suffer while others wallow in abundance. "What should we do?" John the Baptist calls us to respond to their need. He calls us to change our ways so that Christ's saving presence can truly be manifested "in our midst."

Dear Friends in Christ:

Looking ahead to April 15, 2019, and desiring to have accumulated enough 'tax deductible donations' to benefit yourself, your family and your financial stability, it is valuable for you to consider making 'charitable year-end' donations before December 31, 2018. Early in January, our staff will prepare your annual contribution

statement and mail it to you before the final week of January. All donations to St. Lawrence and to St. Philip should be listed for your convenience. If there are omissions or errors, you will have time to correct them and have a 100% accurate 'official statement' prepared for you to present for your tax deductions.

Because our weekly Offertory Donations is *obviously falling short of our 'budgeted need,'* I am appealing to all parish members to follow through with a special, personal, *'charitable year-end'* donation to your parish to offset the serious short-fall.

Some observations include: A. Some people are 'just not coming to Mass' and their Offertory Donations are absent. B. Some people are coming to Mass, but not contributing their envelope offerings to the parish's financial needs. C. Some people are coming to Mass but just dropping a few dollars in cash into the baskets. D. Some people are coming to Mass but not contributing at all financially to the parish. E. Some people are coming to Mass and contributing a fair share through envelope Offerings and for this we are very grateful!

A serious target for our thinking and planning is to come up with ways to make better use of our facilities at St. Philip and St. Lawrence. Fund-raising activities are also community-building activities for those who pitch in, join the action, and enjoy supporting positive and attractive to benefit each parish site. Are our 'activity and social centers' sarcophaguses or are they active sites for community gatherings and profitable activities? Some people are very good at making excuses for inactivity – but we have to become better for creative thinking and experimentation to see what 'can' work.

The special '<u>year-end charitable donation'</u> movement is, hopefully, a stop-gap measure to halt the hemorrhage of parish financial losses. Please consider your parish's best interest as you may be able. Thank you for all that you do for St. Lawrence and St. Philip.



Keeping God's Children Protected and Safe: To know that we are children of God is to live in complete love, with deep abiding security and the ability to dream, to sing, to create, to laugh, and to play without worry.
