

Deacon's Corner

April 23, 2023

The Easter Season and Spring bring the promises of new life. We see the signs of new life everywhere, the trees starting to bud, flowers just beginning to bloom, and the songs of the birds. The resurrection of Christ should help us remember that we have two natures, a physical and a divine. God created each one of us to live in eternity. Our lives on Earth are just the preparation for eternal life in the presence of God our Father. We will all experience suffering, pain, and sorrow as we pass through our mortal life.

This is reflected in St. Paul's Letter to the Romans 8:18,

"I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us."
