There are many epiphanies throughout Sacred Scripture. Beginning with Adams and Eve, the familiarity of Adam and Eve with God who walks with them and talks with them is noteworthy. The angel of God communicates with Moses, Joseph, and many prophets and speakers throughout the Old Testament. A mysterious hand writes on the wall, seas open for People of God.

In special ways, in the course of human events, god has entered into human history with a divine plan or message. The Holy Family, The Birth of Jesus, and major events in Jesus' life we can easily perceive god-Present. These are *epiphanies* and call our attention to God's message and direction.

Look for God's Presence in the small signs of your life. Know that God is with you and responds to your prayer and good intentions. Fell God's Presence and know that you are special in His eyes. When you conform to His Will and respond to His Will, you are truly favored in His eyes.

Deacon's Corner

January 2, 2022

Epiphany of the Lord

This Sunday, we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. Epiphany comes from Greek, meaning "revelation from above." The Church in the first centuries celebrated the Nativity, Visitation of the Magi, Baptism of Christ, and the Wedding of Cana in the single feast of the Epiphany. At the Council of Tours in 567 A.D., Christmas and Epiphany were set as separate feast days.

The Feast of the Epiphany also has rich cultural traditions in various areas of the world. In Italy, La Befana brings sweets and presents to children on the Epiphany. Children in many parts of Latin America, the Philippines, Portugal, and Spain receive their presents on "Three Kings Day." In Ireland, Catholics celebrate "Women's Christmas" on the Epiphany, where women rest from housework and cleaning to celebrate together with a special meal.

What do we know about the three wise men or Magi? We know they did not arrive until later, maybe up to a year and a half after Jesus' birth. The importance of the Magi was that these were the first gentiles to encounter Christ. The Bible is silent on their actual names and how many there were. However, the treasures presented are specifically mentioned in Matthew 2:11, as gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

St. Irenaeus says that the gifts signify the mystery of the Incarnate Word (God who has become man): gold, a symbol of royalty, represents his kingship; frankincense, used in worship, points to his divinity; and myrrh represents his humanity, particularly in his passion and death.

Lastly, may you continue to feel the special blessings and peace of the Christmas season.


