Dear Friends in Christ:

The personality of Jesus comes to us through anecdotal scenes in the Gospel narratives such as in today's Reading. The disciples went away with Jesus after a day's work to a quiet place to rest. While there, Jesus regarded the crowd and stated in pity: "...for they were like sheep without a shepherd." Was he talking to his disciples, was he talking to himself and overheard by his disciples?

In truth, Jesus commented on the crowd here and elsewhere in the Gospel, and expanded his awareness of the personalities following him. He knew their wants and he responded to them directly or through his disciples. In either case, there was a dialogue, a conversation Jesus was having in which he commented on the needs of the crowd and he took upon himself the role of filling that need. In his teaching the disciples, he also defined their role as he taught the Beatitudes.

In either case, the Old Testament rituals were not fulfilling the needs of the people. Jesus was telling his disciples: "You can do better!" He's saying the same to you and me today. "You can do better." Are we trying to do better than mere protocol today? The Old Testament rituals filled a lot of protocols, but left the crowds empty. Our calling is to fill up the people AND fulfill the protocols. How can your witness of faith be better?

Deacon's Corner

July 18, 2021

I have been thinking a lot about prayer lately. It is such an essential part of our faith life. Then why is it so challenging sometimes? In 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18, it says, "Rejoice always, pray constantly, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." Countless articles and books have been written on prayer talking about the many types of prayer, from reflective and contemplative to active

participation. Pray can be very formal and structured or spontaneous. It would take many pages to provide a simple summary.

Even with all this direction on prayer, I sometimes feel like my prayer is "dry," and it is just hard to get started. Maybe if we look at prayer as a daily conversation with God and a little less formal, we can find the words to say like, "Thanks for another day, God" or "Today is going to be a challenge, give me some peace," or "Lord have Mercy." Maybe even just a moment of silence when you don't know what to say. I think that to "pray constantly" means to be aware of God in our lives. How we go about our day through our actions can also be our prayer to God.

So if your prayer may be in a "dry" spell, don't be discouraged; remember God is always listening and just patiently waiting to have a conversation with you.


